St. John Accreditation Five Year Review October 8 and 9

St. John School is accredited by both the state of Kansas and AdvancEd (North Central). Every five years, we have an on-site review conducted by a team of highly qualified peer evaluators who examine our adherence and commitment to AdvancED Standards and continuous improvement. It is a rigorous process that includes the in-depth examination of evidence and relevant data, interviews with parents, students, and teachers, and extensive observations of learning and instruction. After the review, we will receive a comprehensive report on the team's findings. On October 8 and 9 the visiting team will spend two full days evaluating our school.

We invite parents to participate in the parent interview on Thursday, Oct. 8, from 2;30-3:15, in the St. Bosco Room. Parents will share their knowledge, experience, and insights that will help the team understand our school. We need 10 to 15 parents to participate in the interview. If you are interested, please contact the school office or Mrs. Pat Newton.

On Friday, Oct. 9, at 3:45, the exit report will be given by the Lead Evaluator, Eric White, principal of Most Pure Heart of Mary, Topeka. The report shouldn't last more than onehalf hour. All are welcome to attend the presentation.
