SCHEDULE CHANGES AND A BIG THANK YOU!

As you have heard and seen in recent announcements, we will be locking the church doors, including the Padre Pio chapel, after morning Mass on days when the parish office is closed. This includes the Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving (Thursday and Friday), Christmas, New Year's Day, and any other days to be announced. Last Memorial Day, sometime between the hours of 11:30 am and 10:00 pm, the candle donation boxes and the poor box were vandalized. The sacristy door was pried open but nothing was removed from that space. All of the cupboard doors where the servers vest were open as well as the sliding doors to the closets in the sacristy hallway, but neither was anything removed from those areas. I was in the office that day after the cemetery blessing from 11:00 am until 11:30 am and I returned again that evening at approximately 7:30 pm. I was here until 10:00 pm when I went to lock the church and turn off the lights, and discovered the vandalism. The church was open on Memorial Day as it always is every day of the year between the hours of 6:00 am and 6:00 pm.

When the Simon Parish Center is open, various staff members and I make frequent trips between the office and the church. Our custodians also are here on days when the office is open. All of this helps to provide a more secure environment for individuals who pray in the church and in the Padre Pio chapel. That security increases even more when St. John School is in session. Of course, we would want to prevent, in the best way that we can, any further vandalism in the church. Yet, I am concerned more for the safety of those who pray in the Padre Pio chapel. They can feel trapped when there is no other activity between the church and the office or school, especially if someone in temporal need were to approach a lone person in the chapel as did recently happen.

The church will continue to remain open most days of the year, but sadly, we are forced to keep it closed on holidays and other days throughout the year when the office is closed, especially when St. John School is not in session. Our parish prides itself on welcome and hospitality. Locking the church seems to fly directly in the face of that. Yet, in the end, it is for the safety of our parishioners and other visitors, all of whom we want otherwise to continue to feel welcomed.

On a different note, I would like to thank those of you who made a contribution toward the Capuchins' new chapel at St. Conrad Friary. In the bulletin two weeks ago, I listed the costs for various items for the new chapel. Someone already has covered the cost of the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The image is a newer rendition of the Virgin of Guadalupe "written" (icons are not considered paintings) by Brother Pachomius Meade, a monk at Conception Abbey in northwest Missouri. Two other parishioners have covered the cost for the chapel crucifix. Several other donors have made contributions to the general cost of the renovation of the room that has become the new chapel. THANK YOU to those who have contributed! The friars continue to seek your help – we still have the cost of the area rug (for noise abatement as well as aesthetics) at \$900, the chairs with kneelers at \$2,975, and the cost of the room renovation which now stands at \$14,600. If you decide to help us out with any of these items, you can make your check payable to "Capuchin Friars" or "St. Conrad Friary" and send it directly to us (address provided in parish office) or simply bring it to the parish office. You also can mark it and drop it in the collection basket on Sunday. Thanks!

CHAPTER 22: BEYOND TWEAKING

Point to Ponder: The butterfly emerges from the cocoon; it is a beautiful transformation.

Verse to Live: "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see everything become new!" {2 Corinthians 5:17}

Question to Consider: What will be the hardest thing about letting God transform you and your life?

Prayer: Jesus, keep the desire for transformation alive in my heart.

MARRIAGE MINUTE

Often the worst part about an argument with our spouse is the pain we inflict afterwards. We grow the original hurt by rehashing it and adding to it, allowing doubt to creep in. Are we even still in love?

Part of this pain can be avoided by realizing that in a fallen world, spouses will hurt one another, but it does not have to result in permanent division. We are reminded in the Catechism, "what therefore God has joined together, let no man put asunder" (1614). So, we expect sin, but don't let it divide us. How?

Forgiveness is the answer. Jesus says in this Sunday's Gospel, "But the one to whom little is forgiven, loves little." Forgiveness humbles us. It makes us more compassionate. In short, it makes our relationship stronger. So while we shouldn't sin on purpose, we also shouldn't panic when we do. Instead, we should make reconciliation our most urgent task.

SOCIAL JUSTICE, SOCIAL ACTION

In light of the recent death of Father Daniel Berrigan, the social concerns committee thought it fitting to offer here a snapshot of his life.

Daniel Berrigan was born in Virginia, MN on May 9, 1921, one of six sons. His father was physically abusive to his mother. Violence was routine and as he grew older and saw how their neighbors lived, he was astonished to learn "that wives and husbands were not natural enemies."

From his early youth, he formed a deep attachment to the Church and joined the Jesuits straight out of high school. He was ordained a priest in 1952 and was sent to France where he was impressed by the "worker priests" and their vision of a Church which engaged with ordinary people. He was further influenced by priests and lay people in Eastern Europe. Their churches survived on the margins of Communist society and had developed an activism that dated from the experiences of the Nazi concentration camps.

In 1963, Daniel and his brother Philip founded the Catholic Peace Fellowship to oppose the Vietnam War. This was followed by successive interfaith coalitions with Protestants and Jews. Fr. Berrigan was arrested for the first of many times on October 22, 1967 at a Pentagon protest. In January 1968, he and two other peace activists travelled to Hanoi to receive three American prisoners of war from the North Vietnamese government. On their first night, he and the others were packed into a shelter as the city was pounded by bombs. He never forgot the frightened children he saw that night.

This helped motivate his most famous act of dissidence. On May 17, 1968, Daniel, Philip, and other activists burned draft files at the Selective Service office in Catonsville, MD. They were convicted and sentenced to two years imprisonment. While free on bail, they both went underground. Daniel was at large for five months, giving lectures and writing articles opposing the war until he was apprehended.

In September 1980, the brothers committed another act of civil disobedience, damaging warheads and pouring blood on files at a nuclear facility in Pennsylvania. They were convicted and incarcerated once again. In all, Daniel would spend seven years of his life in prison for advocating peace. He never stopped protesting against war, corporate greed, capital punishment, and abortion: "I see an 'interlocking directorate' of death that binds the whole culture...A decent society should no more have an abortion clinic than the Pentagon."

For Father Daniel, all things came together in Jesus and he consistently advocated for the nonviolence commanded by Christ in the gospels: "The only message I have for the world is: We are not allowed to kill innocent people. We are not allowed to be complicit in murder. We are not allowed to be silent while preparations for mass murder proceed in our name, with our money..."

Father Daniel Berrigan died April 30th of this year, cared for by his Jesuit brothers in a simple room in the Bronx.

FOCUS ON THE WORD

Everyday Stewardship

It is interesting the number of high school juniors and seniors that start getting involved in many school clubs, civic organizations, and even church activities. Don't get me wrong. The work they do is often greatly needed in the communities in which they spend their time and give of their talent. And I get it, since I have encouraged my own children to get more involved. However, many of these teens were missing in action during the first years of high school. There is one major motivator that gets them going and parents like me pushing: college applications.

Wouldn't it be awesome if more people, regardless of their age, gave of themselves on a more regular and consistent basis? Too many of us need college applications or job resumes as motivation to get involved. What if more people did all these things simply because they had been changed into people that could see themselves living life no other way?

If we are to be crucified with Christ, we should see no other way of living. And our motivation matters, because we can't gain eternal life from giving of ourselves. Only faith in Christ can give us that. We act a certain way because, as Paul said to the Galatians, "Yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me." Good stewardship is not about actions; it is a way of living. You don't give of yourself because it is the right thing to do, but instead because it is what you do.

In the end, the stewardship way of life won't get you into a good college or get you a great job. Also, it won't gain you eternal life. But you will live eternally with God, not because of what you did, but because when God looks he won't see you, he will see Jesus.

"Bringing an alabaster flask of ointment, she stood behind him at his feet weeping and began to bathe his feet with her tears." This woman gave everything she had to Jesus in her courageous display of public repentance.

The flask of ointment, for starters, was undoubtedly very expensive. To anoint Jesus in this way was to pamper him with a luxury. Thus she honored Jesus with the best gift she could give. But more than this external offering, the woman also "gave" Jesus her tears. She wept for her sins, for the hope of forgiveness, and for the love of Christ. She literally poured herself out before Jesus as she revealed the depths of her soul. Also, to wipe his feet with her hair was to give the gift of her humility. Cleaning someone's feet is a lowly task to begin with; but to use her own hair for the job revealed that she did not think of herself as "too good." Simon the Pharisee, on the other hand, had exactly that problem.

Jesus used the opportunity to distinguish between those who love much, and those who love little. The self-righteous, like Simon, have little room in their hearts for love of others because they are so full of the love of themselves. They feel they have nothing to repent for. This woman, however, acknowledged her weakness humbly and was all the more ready and willing to love.

We, of course, are challenged to be as generous, courageous, and humble as this sinful woman. We are called not to compare our sins to others' that are "worse" than ours, but rather to honestly recognize where we have failed. Then, like this woman, we can show great love to Christ by giving him the very best of what we have.

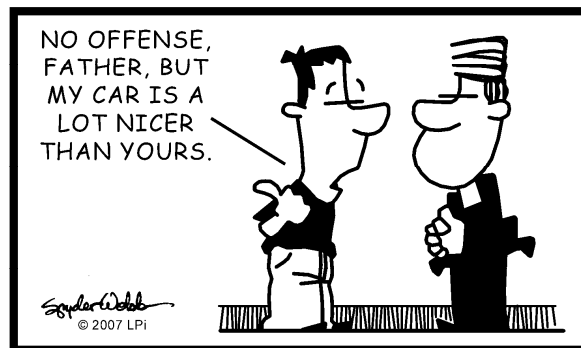
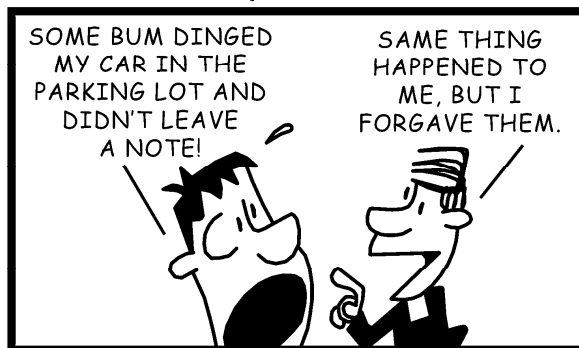
