
BREAD TO OFFER

RESURREXIT SICUT DIXIT!

"He has risen as he said!"

These words are one of the responses in the Easter prayer to the Blessed Virgin Mary, "Regina Coeli":



"Queen of Heaven rejoice, Alleluia!
For he whom you merited to bear, Alleluia!
Has risen as he said, Alleluia!
Pray for us to God, Alleluia!"

Rejoice and be glad O Virgin Mary, Alleluia!
For the Lord is truly risen, Alleluia!

This same joyful proclamation is found in today's Gospel reading from Matthew: "I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said."

In its liturgy and prayers of the Easter Season, the Church rejoices and celebrates Christ's Resurrection from the dead. The resurrection is the high point of the liturgical year because Christ's rising from the dead destroyed the power of death – death no longer as the final word. Yes, death is still a reality, but not the end. St. Paul expresses this in his triumphant words, "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" (1 Corinthians 15:55). And so we believe that this life is the beginning of the eternal life that Christ made possible for us in his death and resurrection: "But thanks be to God" Paul says "who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (15:57). The resurrection is the foundation of our faith. Without the resurrection, there is no point in faith. Again, in the words of St. Paul:

For if the dead are not raised, neither has Christ been raised, and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain; you are still in your sins. Then those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all (1 Corinthians 15: 16-19).

The fifteenth chapter of the first letter to the Corinthians is a great inspiration for our faith. Paul's articulation of what we believe is theological, but it is direct and easily understandable. Reading it inspires encouragement and joy for our life of faith!

May the joy of the Easter Season and of the Risen Lord Jesus remain with you always!

JUSTICE MATTERS

WORKING FOR JUSTICE IN LAWRENCE AND DOUGLAS COUNTY

Nearly 1500 supporters present on March 30 at the Lied Center for the Nehemiah Action Assembly witnessed The Childhood Trauma Research Group presentation to Margaret Holman, MD, Lawrence Memorial Ob-Gyn Group, of the Nehemiah Award for implementing an assessment program for expecting parents using an ACEs-based survey. Waco Goodnight, MD, Panda Pediatrics, and Jenn Preston, Douglas Health Department, were also commended for their part in screening babies and providing services to prevent passing down traumas from generation to generation.



Childhood trauma, defined as exposure to three or more Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), poses a significant public health issue for our community. (ACEs include experiences such as child abuse or neglect, parental mental illness, substance abuse or incarceration, divorce and domestic violence.) A new survey estimates that 1 in 5 Douglas County children has experienced childhood trauma, putting them at high risk for lifelong physical and mental health problems, which can also be transmitted to future generations. Identifying and addressing ACEs early in life (birth to age 5) can reduce these negative consequences and help break the cycle of intergenerational trauma.

A significant body of research initiated by the Centers for Disease Control and Kaiser Permanente in the 1990's has demonstrated the correlation between exposure to ACEs and adverse health consequences. (www.cdc.gov/violenceprevention/acestudy/) ACEs negatively impact brain development in young children and also affect both immune and hormonal systems. ACEs have been implicated in seven of the 10 leading causes of death, as well as depression, alcohol and substance abuse. Preventing ACEs and mitigating their impact when they do occur can change the trajectory of children's lives and create positive short- and long-term health outcomes for our community.

DOMINGO DE PASCUA


Pero de repente Jesús les salió al encuentro y las saludó. Ellas se le acercaron, le abrazaron los pies y lo adoraron. Entonces les dijo Jesús: "No tengan miedo. Vayan a decir a mis hermanos que se dirijan a Galilea. Allá me verán" (Mt 28, 9-10). ¡Qué belleza de mensaje! Te imaginas que de repente el Señor se aparezca a ti y te diga la paz esté contigo. Y te ponga una cita como ahí te veré con tu familia y con tus amigos. ¿Qué sería lo primero que harías? El Evangelio nos dice que las mujeres se asustaron pero que el Señor las calma y envía de misioneras a anunciar su mensaje a sus hermanos.

Has notado que las mujeres de este pasaje del Evangelio no tienen nombre. ¿Por qué será? Lo imaginas. Es sencillamente porque esas mujeres podemos ser tu y yo, hombre y mujer a los que se aparece el Señor. Este día de Resurrección, no debemos ser simples espectadores. Este día salimos de nuestra tumba del miedo. Resucitar debe ser una experiencia personal de cada cristiano. Vivir como personas resucitadas implica transformar la manera vieja de vivir por una nueva, perfumada y llena de Cristo resucitado. Por esa razón completamos nuestra Cuaresma, por lo mismo nos reconciliamos con nosotros mismos, con la familia, con la comunidad y muy especialmente con Dios. San Pablo lo explica así: "Lo mismo ustedes, considérense muertos al pecado y vivos para Dios en Cristo Jesús" (Rom 6, 11). ¡Felices Pascuas de Resurrección!

DOMINGO DE PASCUA

Cada creyente fiel al Señor recita en el credo la siguiente frase domingo a domingo: "Creemos en la resurrección de los muertos". Es decir, creemos en la reconstrucción de la persona humana.
