

NEHEMIAH ACTION ASSEMBLY ATTENDANCE

Each congregation affiliated with Justice Matters has what we call an AWA (average weekly attendance). The faith groups are encouraged to bring out once a year to the Nehemiah Action Assembly the same number of people who attend services 52 times a year. St. John's AWA is 1200 or more. Our goal, because we have so few team leaders and network members was first set at 250 – a far cry from our 1200 AWA. As the 'season' progressed and some network members dropped by the way side our goal was lowered to 200. We came close. We had 178 tickets with St. John marked as the congregation or the name of one of our network members as the inviter. Who knows, we may have made our goal or exceeded it as there were over 100 blank tickets turned in that no congregation can claim.

The Lied Center estimated attendance at 1500. And St. John Parish can take credit for about 200 participants. Thanks to all of you who came to bolster our people power and to support the purposed solutions to community challenges. We aren't a group to point out failings and weaknesses in our city and county systems without offering alternatives and solutions. You can be proud of your part in standing up and speaking out for our sisters and brothers in need.



FOCUS ON THE WORD

2ND SUNDAY OF EASTER

"Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, 'Peace be with you.'" Three times in today's Gospel, Jesus speaks these words to his disciples. He knew they were in need of peace! Following the Crucifixion, they had huddled in fear, hiding behind locked doors, "for fear of the Jews." But the risen Christ burst into this prison of anxiety to set the disciples free.

We may wonder why, after his first greeting of peace, Jesus immediately showed the disciples the wounds of his crucifixion, still present in his now glorified body. Why would he speak of peace and then show them the scars from the violence of the cross? Perhaps it is because those wounds earned our forgiveness. And this forgiveness is our peace.

Although we may not suffer from the fear of martyrdom as these first disciples did, we all need the peace that comes from being forgiven, and from forgiving. Our sins enslave us by preventing us from experiencing the fullness of life. But Jesus' mercy is greater than our sins. He wants to forgive us. And, as he taught us, we are supposed to "forgive those who trespass against us" as well. Perhaps we harbor grudges towards neighbors or family members who have hurt us. We are called to extend forgiveness to them, just as Christ extends forgiveness to us. In this way, we can cooperate with Christ by spreading peace to others. "As the Father has sent me, so I send you," he told the disciples gathered in the room. We too are sent to be messengers of Christ's peace and mercy.

Especially today, on this Sunday of Divine Mercy, may we accept from Jesus his promise of forgiveness. Then, we will truly be able to "go in peace."

Jesus, I can hardly wait to see you in heaven.




SOCIAL JUSTICE, SOCIAL ACTION

With Earth Day this weekend and spring upon us, it might be a good time for Catholics to read or re-read Laudato Si. (visit laudatosi.com/watch to read online or download a copy).

It is Pope Francis' Encyclical, or teaching, on Care of Our Common Home. This powerful and far-reaching letter is a perfect moral teaching speaking to Catholics and people of all faiths. The Pope paints a beautiful picture of how to build a better future for our amazing planet.

He states; "I urgently appeal, then, for a new dialogue about how we are shaping the future of our planet. We need a conversation which includes everyone, since the environmental challenge we are undergoing, and its human roots, concern and affect us all." Consistent with the Pope's Encyclical, there seems to be a moral shift in our national politics. House Republicans have submitted a resolution to address Climate Change (H. Res 195). It essentially says; "Let's talk about climate change." Important Catholic Voices have expressed their support and gratitude.

At the USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) Bishop Frank Dewane of Venice, FL and Bishop Oscar Cantu of Las Cruces, each Chairs of USCCB Committees, welcomed the commitment of these legislators to address the challenge of climate change. Bishop Dewane has voiced support for a national carbon emission standard and opposes the recent environmental executive order rescinding and weakening numerous environmental protections which effectively dismantle the Clean Power Plan (CPP).


Catholic Relief Services (CRS) also extended its appreciation. They signed a joint letter in support of the resolution and "...[called] on Members of the House ... to support the Climate Solutions Caucus, a bipartisan effort to develop solutions to climate change challenges." As of this writing there are 18 Republican US House members and 18 Democratic US House members on the caucus. The number is growing almost weekly. A bipartisan conversation is exciting! A shift in the GOP's party stance on the issue is refreshing.

Catholic Climate Covenant urges us to encourage our Members of Congress to join the bipartisan Climate Solutions Caucus. On the advocacy page of their website, anyone can encourage their representative to join the Caucus. Let our representative; Lynn Jenkins, know that you want her to join the Climate Solutions Caucus. Write your representative or visit CatholicClimateCovenant.org and follow the links to advocate. Your letter can be as simple as "I am concerned about climate change because... and I would like for you to participate in the Climate Solutions Caucus."

In addition a letter signed by 16 national Catholic institutions quotes Catholic Social Teaching and states their commitment to "protect human life and dignity, to prioritize the needs of poor and vulnerable peoples, and to care for God's creation of which we are a part." The Republican Climate Resolution also boasts the broad support of over 50 religions leaders and organizations ranging from Evangelical to Catholic, Jewish to Quaker.

You may wish to seek to influence Speaker of the House Paul Ryan (a Catholic). Let's work to persuade Kansas US Congress members: Lynn Jenkins (2nd district), Kevin Yoder (3rd), Roger Marshall (1st) and who knows, Mike Estes (4th) to add their voices to the caucus. Encourage Catholics in those districts to write. And pray and work to overcome divisions that have prevented climate action. Our moral obligation to address climate change and protect vulnerable communities transcends partisanship.

La liturgia de hoy pretende hacernos vivir y vibrar con los apóstoles la primera semana de la Resurrección.

Por lo tanto, cabe preguntarnos lo siguiente. ¿Cómo estamos celebrando la Pascua? ¿Dónde vemos la misericordia de Dios en nuestra vida? ¿Creemos porque hemos visto? O, dejaremos que el Señor nos diga: "¡Dichosos los que creen sin haber visto!" (Jn 20, 29). La paciencia de Dios se manifiesta en este pasaje del Evangelio. Cristo es el objetivo y la meta de cualquier experiencia de la Iglesia y su comunidad. Ahora, con el sople del Espíritu Santo, y la paz deseada los apóstoles ahí reunidos tendrán que responder con un espíritu nuevo y valentía renovada al compromiso de llevar a cabo la misión de anunciar el kerigma primitivo de la Iglesia. Pasión, muerte, resurrección y gloria de Cristo resucitado. ¡Qué hermosa noticia! Invita y anima al bautizado a caminar hacia su destino de gloria, aun en medio de sus penas y amarguras de su vida actual. Hagamos oración para que en esta Pascua lleguemos a descubrir cómo "Jesús de Nazaret con su palabra, con sus gestos y con toda su persona revela la misericordia de Dios" (Misericordiae Vultus, número 1).

2º DOMINGO DE PASCUA

El dolor en la vida nos une. Lo hemos experimentado con la muerte de algún ser querido. La muerte agrupa, enseña a compartir, se aprende a tener misericordia de los unos para con los otros. Sí, has acertado: tenían destrozado el corazón. En el Calvario había muerto su esperanza. Los discípulos estaban seguramente llenos de dolor por la muerte de aquél que tanto habían querido y que tantos horizontes les había abierto. Todo había quedado tan solo en desconcierto, dolor y miedo. ¿Qué sucederá ahora?

Pero pasa algo extraño. Se vuelven a agrupar, pues la muerte de Jesús los ha reunido. Algo fuerte les dice que deben estar juntos, que la comunidad alrededor de Jesús debe seguir viva. El primer día de la semana, al amanecer del domingo, María Magdalena y las demás mujeres corren la voz de un testimonio increíble. ¡Jesús está vivo! El mismo Pedro y el otro discípulo lo aseguran también. Desde entonces, domingo a domingo, la comunidad se sigue reuniendo para celebrar a Jesús resucitado. Cada domingo el Señor nos da su paz y nos fortalece con su misericordia y amor. El Señor nos envía a ser testigos de una vida distinta, mediante su Espíritu que nos acompaña. El miedo ha quedado atrás y las dudas de Tomás también. ¡Jesús anima y camina con nosotros desde la primera Pascua! ¿En qué se va a notar que esta Pascua del 2014 nos dejemos llevar por la misericordia de Cristo?
