THE WORLD JESUS KNEW

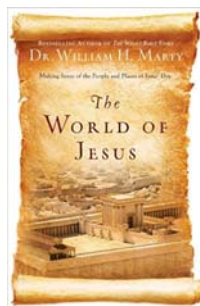
A NEW CLASS FOR THE NEW YEAR WITH FR. BARNABAS!

In order to grow in one’s understanding of Scripture one needs to know a bit about the historical context in which the scriptures were written. The better one knows the cultural customs, geography, people and places of the Holy Land at the time of Christ, the better one can understand the Lord’s message and how it applies to us today. **Beginning this Tuesday, January 24th, at 7:00 p.m. in the church basement,** I will be offering an introductory class on the world that Jesus knew and in which he lived.

The class will cover such topics as the cultural ways Jesus followed, the festivals Jesus celebrated, the education Jesus received, the agricultural ways he observed, and the land he crossed. The class will also look at the different groups of people that existed in the Lord’s day and their historical backgrounds. This will include, of course, the Sadducees, the Pharisees and the Zealots... Who are they? Where did they come from? And what is their importance?

A basic understanding of the political background and history of the Holy Land is also important when it comes to growing in love, knowledge, and application of Scripture as well. This class will introduce you to a bit of the history that formed and shaped the Holy Land of the Lord’s day. We will cover the origins of King Herod and the history of the Jewish return from exile and the rebuilding of the Temple. This class is intended to be an introduction to the above topics so that you can read, understand, and then better apply the Scriptures to your own life and to the world around you.

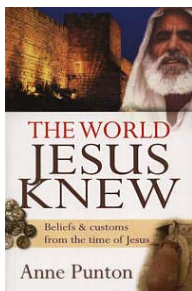

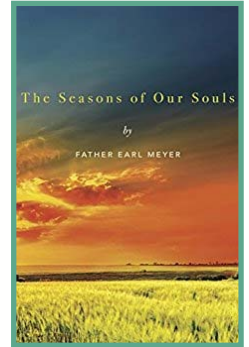

SOCIAL JUSTICE SOCIAL ACTION

CLIMATE CHANGE AND RELIGION (PART 2)

Pope Francis has begun the process of changing concern about climate change with his Encyclical Laudato Si. He calls for a new dialogue about how we are shaping the future of our planet. "I wish to address every person living on this planet about our common home. My appeal is to bring the human family together." "Leaving an inhabitable planet has to do with the ultimate meaning of our earthly sojourn. What kind of world do we want to leave? What is the purpose of our life in this world?" Evangelical Christian and Texas Tech climate science professor Katharine Hayhoe says; "The facts are not enough. When we look at the planet, whatever it is telling us is an expression of what God has defined it to be. So instead of studying science, I feel like I'm studying what God was thinking when he set up our planet."

Sir John Houghton, who founded and chaired the United Nations IPCC 14 years ago, is a Methodist preacher. He says "God creates the laws and my role as a scientist is discovering them." There are no clear dividing lines between the rational and the emotional brains, but rather a conversation between the two. We know what needs to be done, we know how it must be done, unfortunately it is a long journey from the head to the heart; and it is even longer from the heart to the hands. It requires short term losses to avoid long term costs.

Religion faces similar obstacles and calls on people to restrain their worldly desires with abstinence and self-restraint. Religions embody long term thinking, encouraging responsibilities to invest in a legacy; and protecting creation, generation to generation. Religions have found tried and tested models through the power of social proof and communicator trust. Churches focus on what moves, excites, and persuades people. They have proven to have the power to galvanize. Western, educated, industrialized, rich, democratic perspectives suggest that people will never make a sacrifice because of the rational calculation. We're too self-centered.

But religions contain sacred values, entirely nonnegotiable, that cannot be bought or sold, and sacrifice will be made to defend them. A radical solution would turn action on climate into a non-negotiable sacred value through missionary outreach, with a high status to missionary service and the ritual of community. Religion has made society divine, the reward is belonging.

Everyone is going to have doubts and struggles. There must be a moment of choice to break the bystander effect. We need to welcome, support and honor those who are taking action on climate, by being there with them. As climate impacts increase there will be a frantic rush to set up good guys versus bad guys. Forgiveness is about transforming guilt into positive emotions such as empathy and reconstruction. Scientific data does not galvanize our emotional brain into action. Conviction crosses into the emotional, the head into the heart. Uncertainties, anxieties and fears, all need to be openly recognized to address the feelings of blame and guilt that lead people to ignore; instead to be forgiven, to aim higher, and sidestep the arid cost-benefit calculations.
