#### ONLINE GIVING RENEWAL PROCESS

#### How to renew your Online Giving account:

Thank you for generous support of St. John through the online giving program. There are some steps you will need to take in order to update your information in Online Giving for the coming pledge year. Each year these steps can be taken only if changes need to be made in the amount or the date that your tithe is withdrawn.

#### Steps to take:

- Login to your ACCOUNT. You can find the Online Giving link on the St. John website home page www.sjevangelist.com. (If you need to find out your username or password check your junk mail when they send the email with that information)
- Click on "My Active Online Giving" This gives a list of all your active giving. Take a note of the gift type that you have clicked. (Pledge or Recurring)
  - A. If the "Gift type is Pledge" Payments will end when that pledge amount is reached. You will need to go in and change that to a recurring gift. You can do that by clicking on "Give a New Gift" and enter as a recurring gift.
  - B. It the "Gift type is Recurring" Payments will continue until you tell them to stop. If you wish to change the amount or the date which the payment is withdrawn you will do this from the "My Active Online Giving" screen (at the end of the line there is a little pencil, click on the pencil to change the amount and/or date).


# THE WORLD **JESUS KNEW**

#### A NEW CLASS FOR THE NEW YEAR WITH FR. BARNABAS!

In order to grow in one's understanding of Scripture one needs to know a bit about the historical context in which the scriptures were written. The better one knows the cultural customs, geography, people and places of the Holy Land at the time of Christ, the better one can understand the Lord's message and how it applies to us today. **Beginning January 24th at 7:00 p.m. in the church basement**, I will be offering an introductory class on the world that Jesus knew and in which he lived.

The class will cover such topics as the cultural ways Jesus followed, the festivals Jesus celebrated, the education Jesus received, the agricultural ways he observed, and the land he crossed. The class will also look at the different groups of people that existed in the Lord's day and their historical backgrounds. This will include, of course, the Sadducees, the Pharisees and the Zealots... Who are they? Where did they come from? And what is their importance?


A basic understanding of the political background and history of the Holy Land is also important when it comes to growing in love, knowledge, and application of Scripture as well. This class will introduce you to a bit of the history that formed and shaped the Holy Land of the Lord's day. We will cover the origins of King Herod and the history of the Jewish return from exile and the rebuilding of the Temple. This class is intended to be an introduction to the above topics so that you can read, understand, and then better apply the Scriptures to your own life and to the world around you.

## — New Year's Resolution ——

#### To the Men of St. John Parish:

Do you want to be a "Go to" guy for the priests of our parish? Why not make this year's resolution to donate a few hours each month to your church and grow your faith in Christ while doing so.

There is a group of men doing exactly that. Their mission is charity and through donating a few hours each month they are able to maintain a charitable account to fund various groups.

- 1. They host a golf tournament in which all proceeds go to their charities account.
- 2. They try to get one men's KU basketball game to clean up the fieldhouse following the game and put that money in their charities account.
- 3. They host a yearly Tootsie Roll Drive in which these profits go to the Douglas County Special Olympics.
- 4. There is a cemetery, consisting of 10 acres, just east of the Lawrence city limits owned by the Archdiocese. As Mount Calvary starts to get closer to full capacity, this group of men are volunteering their time to get this 10 acres ready for use. This will be a 3 to 5 year project.
- 5. These men volunteer their time in weekly mowing and clean up of the church and friary grounds.
- 6. These men volunteer their time for various church functions, i.e. Fiesta, Oktoberfest, and St. John School Auction.
- 7. We host the Friday Lenten Fish Fry's and all proceeds go to our charities account.
- 8. We host various Sunday Morning breakfasts and brunches with all proceeds also going to our charities account.
- 9. We volunteer our time to put on the annual parish picnic.

These are just some of the volunteer works that these men do.

#### **Current charities:**

Lawrence Pregnancy Care Center, Boys and Girl Scouts, local seminarian support, support of the St. Lawrence Community, Pennies for Heaven, EDAP (Emergency Disaster Program), Douglas County Blood Drive, St. John Scholarship Fund for High School Parishioner, and many more smaller donations.

They gather along with their families on the first Friday of the month at 6:30pm in the church to pray and celebrate the rosary together.

Our founder, Fr. McGivney, organized a group of men to perform these deeds. We are now the largest Catholic men's organization in the world and are looking for Catholic men to join our ranks and help with our cause of charitable ministries.

# SOCIAL JUSTICE SOCIAL ACTION

On December 13, Pope Francis released the annual World Day of Peace Message for January 1, 2017, called "Nonviolence—A Style of Politics for Peace." This is the Vatican's fiftieth World Day of Peace message, but it's the first statement on nonviolence, in the tradition of Mahatma Gandhi and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.—in history. Here are some more excerpts:

#### **Practicing the Nonviolence of Jesus**

Jesus lived and taught nonviolence, which Francis calls "a radically positive approach." Jesus "unfailingly preached God's unconditional love, which welcomes and forgives. He taught his disciples to love their enemies (cf. Mt 5:44) and to turn the other cheek (cf. Mt 5:39). When he stopped her accusers from stoning the woman caught in adultery (cf. Jn 8:1-11), and when, on the night before he died, he told Peter to put away his sword (cf. Mt 26:52), Jesus marked out the path of nonviolence. He walked that path to the very end, to the cross, whereby he became our peace and put an end to hostility (cf. Eph 2:14-16). Whoever accepts the Good News of Jesus is able to acknowledge the violence within and be healed by God's mercy, becoming in turn an instrument of reconciliation."

"To be true followers of Jesus today also includes embracing his teaching about nonviolence," Francis writes. He quotes Pope Benedict who said that the command to love our enemies "is the magna carta of Christian nonviolence. It does not consist in succumbing to evil..., but in responding to evil with good and thereby breaking the chain of injustice."

"The decisive and consistent practice of nonviolence has produced impressive results," Francis explains. "The achievements of Mahatma Gandhi and Khan Abdul Ghaffar Khan in the liberation of India, and of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr in combating racial discrimination will never be forgotten. Women in particular are often leaders of nonviolence, as for example, was Leymah Gbowee and the thousands of Liberian women, who organized pray-ins and nonviolent protest that resulted in high-level peace talks to end the second civil war in Liberia. The Church has been involved in nonviolent peacebuilding strategies in many countries, engaging even the most violent parties in efforts to build a just and lasting peace. Let us never tire of repeating: 'The name of God cannot be used to justify violence. Peace alone is holy. Peace alone is holy, not war!'

"If violence has its source in the human heart, then it is fundamental that nonviolence be practiced within families," Francis writes. "I plead with equal urgency for an end to domestic violence and to the abuse of women and children. The politics of nonviolence have to begin in the home and then spread to the entire human family."

"An ethics of fraternity and peaceful coexistence between individuals and among peoples cannot be based on the logic of fear, violence and closed-mindedness, but on responsibility, respect and sincere dialogue," Francis continues. "I plead for disarmament and for the prohibition and abolition of nuclear weapons: nuclear deterrence and the threat of mutual assured destruction are incapable of grounding such an ethics (of nonviolence)."

# FOCUS ON THE WORD

#### THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

"And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was." In our day and age, the star of Christmas has become a kind of decorative symbol that adorns manger scenes and Christmas trees. It suggests something good and bright and holy, a visual indicator that the "Light of the world" has appeared. But today, on the feast of the Epiphany, we recall that originally, this star was not just a pretty symbolic ornament. This star was a sign from God that intervened in the operations of the physical universe. The Magi understood that this star was sent from God to indicate where his Son would be born.

Of course it should not surprise us in this season of all seasons that God should choose to order the universe according to his purposes. Jesus has just been born of a virgin! God has just taken on human flesh. These events in themselves are extraordinary divine interventions--miracles that defy the standard operation of things. Why shouldn't God choose to send a luminous star where he wants it, when he wants it? Why shouldn't he reveal his plan through the things that he created in the first place?

The beauty of today's feast is found, in part, in the fact that the Magi were able to recognize this sign from God.
