


On the first Friday of each month, the Knights host a rosary in St. John Church starting at 6:30 p.m.

LIFE AS A PARTNERSHIP WITH CHRIST

Our Lord has invited each of us to "come and see" what our God is like. Unfortunately, this invitation seems to frighten a lot of people because we are afraid that we have to go it alone. Nothing could be further from the truth, because God intends that your life should be a partnership with Christ.

There is no greater drama in life than a soul's journey towards God. This journey is not a lonely, one-sided affair. The Lord expects to play a very intimate part in your life drama and the Lord is with us every step of the way, through our prayers, the prayers of the saints in Heaven, and in the sacraments.

A partnership is defined as "an association of persons joined together for a certain purpose." The purpose of this partnership is to achieve the perfect love of God, and so this spiritual project takes place between you and the Eternal Son of God. This partnership and journey towards God is the most inspiring and joyful truths of our Faith.

Your partnership with Jesus began on the day of your Baptism. By this sacrament, our Lord gives us the gift of the Holy Spirit to guide and inspire our every action, change us into an image of Himself and prepare us to receive Him in the Eucharist.

Our "putting on Christ" can be difficult at times because our journey towards Him takes time. On the one hand we enjoy this living partnership with our Lord; on the other, we suffer the constant temptations arising from our fallen human nature, which afflicts us with the downward pull of the world. However, we do not wage this battle alone because the Lord is always with us: there is not a single moment of your life when He is not carrying in you in His mind and heart.

The greatest proof that your life is truly a partnership with Christ is found in the Eucharist. In this sacrament, He gives himself to you. In it He also invites you to make a wholehearted offering of yourself and your life. Here your life is united to His in a sacred action that is the very center of this partnership.

The amazing truth is that the son of God, who first lived His life for you, now wishes to relive His life in you. You are born to this Christ-life in baptism. You are encouraged to gradually grow in Christ. And you are expected to share His suffering life to some degree and thus to merit a share of His glorified life. You should be convinced of the absolute readiness of our Lord to share everything He has with you, and you should invite Him to enter into every part of your everyday life!

JUSTICE MATTERS



AN INTERFAITH NETWORK DOING JUSTICE IN LAWRENCE AND DOUGLAS COUNTY

Racial Equality is an issue being addressed by Justice Matters. It was voted on by the membership as our fifth issue in November, 2016. The Justice Matters research group traveled to Wichita to visit with teachers and school officials who have adopted a successful restorative justice program.

In Lawrence, a black student is twice as likely to be suspended and half as likely to be in a gifted or AP class as his white peers. The achievement gap is real and it can be reduced. Racial bullying by fellow students or teachers on staff doesn't have to be tolerated or hidden. Accountability, transparency, and restoration can be the rule rather than the exception.

Restorative justice programs in schools are spreading across the country. As an approach to school discipline and student-teacher relationships, it focuses on healing harm instead of simply dispensing consequences. It's been shown to reduce suspensions and improve academic outcomes for students of color. It's a real alternative to the status quo.

The Institutional Racism Committee will present information about the restorative justice to the Lawrence School Board on June 26 at 7 pm. at the district offices, 110 McDonald Drive. All are invited to hear the presentation and show support for restorative justice in our District 497 schools.

FOCUS ON THE WORD

12TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Even all the hairs of your head are counted. So do not be afraid." Can it really be true? Is our heavenly Father actually so aware of us? Does the Creator of the universe pay that much attention to me? Jesus says yes. God knows us far more intimately than we even know ourselves. And so, we have nothing to fear.

Being Christian isn't guaranteed to be easy. More and more even in our own culture, following the faith is being criticized and discouraged in the public square. Privately, we may struggle with the demands of the commandments or the ability to believe when we face the inevitable trials that come our way. But passages like this one in today's Gospel are a source of tremendous hope and consolation. We are loved beyond measure. We enjoy the care and concern of God in every situation, big and small. Truly we have no need to worry or be anxious because God is in control.

For our part, of course, Jesus asks us to trust him and stay faithful. He asks us not to apologize for our faith, especially publicly. "Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father." When we live our faith with confidence, it's a way of accepting the power and providence of God. But when we try to hide our faith away because we're afraid of causing problems, we only damage our relationship with the One who can actually solve them.

At the end of the day, the only really serious problem we need to worry about is losing our soul-and that, to be sure, is up to us. As the great French novelist Léon Bloy wrote, "There is only one tragedy in the end: not to have been a saint."



12° DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Los seres humanos vamos adquiriendo confianza de acuerdo a cómo se nos trata desde pequeños. Así es como recordamos a nuestros padres repitiéndonos que no tengamos miedo, ya sea al comenzar a caminar o en nuestro primer día de escuela. Así pasa la vida y nos seguimos diciendo para nuestros adentros: "no debo tener miedo a vivir", "no debo tener miedo a cruzar la frontera", "no debo de sentir temor a trabajar en un país extraño". Pero no olvidemos que la fe, la misericordia, y la confianza en Dios deben ser nuestros estandartes para superar todos nuestros miedos. Si Dios está con nosotros, nadie ni nada nos puede hacer daño. ¡Tengamos confianza en él!
