SUMMER CHANGES

You will have noticed that for the summer our office schedule is scaled back extensively. We vacated the Simon Parish Center this past week to make room for demolition and construction in that space and in the adjoining convent. We have relocated to the school until mid-August when we are scheduled to move into the expanded parish office space. We have the same parish phone number 785-843-0109, which is answered by parish staff located in the school office. Entry to the temporary parish office is through the main school entry on the Kentucky Street side. Enter the door then take the stairs to the upper floor where you will be directed to the parish office. Office hours are 8:30 am – noon Monday through Friday (except July 3rd & 4th). We also trimmed hours this summer so that some parish staff might go part time in an effort to help our deficit budget. Staff members generously took a cut in pay this year to help us out, even though they continue to fulfill their pledge to the annual stewardship appeal and to the “Preserving our Past . . . Building Our Future!” building campaign. You pay very talented people a modest salary to do amazing things in our parish administration – they are extremely dedicated and generous people – and so are you!

Due to the limited presence of staff on campus throughout the summer, I have asked that we limit the hours for Eucharistic Adoration in the Padre Pio chapel. The chapel will be open when the parish office is open. We are doing this for security reasons, as on occasion we continue to have individuals with specific needs who sometimes approach our parishioners for money. That is not a bad thing, but last year one individual became verbally aggressive with a lady who was in the chapel by herself. She felt trapped in the chapel alone with that person. After giving the man \$2, he left and she was unhurt. As pastor, I have the responsibility for the safety of our parishioners when they are on parish property. I am obliged to take reasonable precautions to ensure a prayerful space that is available and accessible yes, but also one that is safe and welcoming. Reducing the hours of adoration will not provide 100% prevention of another threatening occurrence, but it will greatly reduce the likelihood of its happening. Having people on our campus is the best security measure we can provide. Confessions will continue on Wednesdays from 11:00 – 12:00 noon, but people can sign up for Wednesday morning hours of adoration. Once school resumes, we will return to regular hours for the office and for Eucharistic Adoration.

A while back I mentioned that we would be selling the Catholic Charities house at 1247 Kentucky Street in order to help our budget and building campaign. The house sold two weeks ago with a closing date of July 1st, 2017. Catholic Charities has found a new location into which they hope to move by the end of July. They will relocate temporarily in one of our little houses at the south end of our property at 200 13th street until their new location becomes available (they will publish their new address and contact information). Due to space limitations, their services at the little parish house will be limited to references and vouchers. They will not provide a food pantry at that location. Because the Simon Parish Center will be closed for construction from May 24th through August 15th, St. John Parish will not be accepting donations for Catholic Charities food pantry during that time. St. John Parish will resume its reception of food donations for Catholic Charities’ new location on August 15th.

Monday is Memorial Day, a time in which our nation honors those who lost their lives while serving our nation in the armed forces. We will have a special memorial Mass for our fallen troops on Monday at 9:00 am **in the church**. Immediately following will be a blessing of our cemetery. All are invited to attend either or both events. The Knights of Columbus did request to have a Mass at the cemetery and other parishes in the Archdiocese will be doing that. However, I opted to have the Mass in the church mainly because walking around in the cemetery is precarious for seniors and others who are unsure of footing, but also because of the unpredictability of the weather. It requires a lot of organization and work to set up chairs and accessories for a cemetery Mass. It seems more reasonable to me to have the memorial Mass in the church where people can move around more easily and where we can have the Mass in any type of weather. Logistically, much less is involved with having only the blessing in the cemetery. Honestly, I would love to do the Mass at the cemetery. Yet, out of charity, it seems best to have a that special memorial Mass in a location where any might attend who wish.

Thank you for your cards and well-wishes regarding my shoulder surgery. Thanks to your prayers, recovery has gone very well and I hope to begin physical therapy next week.

SOCIAL JUSTICE, SOCIAL ACTION

Pacem in Terris was Saint Pope John XXIII's final encyclical, published on April 11, 1963. In it, he incorporated Sacred Scripture as well as the writings of St. Augustine, St. Thomas Aquinas, and Popes Leo XIII, Benedict XV, Pius XI, and Pius XII. The encyclical appeared shortly after the Cuban Missile Crisis and the threat of nuclear war weighed on people the world over.

Rather than focus on the nuclear threat, however, the Pope describes the natural order of God's creation and His merciful intention for us. Peace will not come about through "an equal balance of armaments," says John. Instead, he enumerates the rights that must be protected by all authorities in order for peace to prevail. These include the necessities of life, i.e. food, shelter, clothing, and medical care. Additionally, all persons have the right to honest labor with a just wage and decent conditions. We are entitled to a good education, to receive accurate information, to seek truth as we will, and to emigrate and immigrate without undue restriction. The Pope lauds the progress he sees toward improving workers' rights, the emancipation of women, and the self-determination of emerging nation-states.

Reaction to Pacem in Terris was widely favorable. As the first papal encyclical addressed to Catholics and non-Catholics alike, the Washington Post called it "the voice of the conscience of the world." It was the first encyclical printed in full in the New York Times and was praised by parties as diverse as European Communists and the United States government. President John F. Kennedy said, "As a Catholic, I am proud of it; and as an American, I have learned from it."

Saint Pope John XXIII died on June 3, 1963.

3. Bold prophetic leadership from faith communities: At this moment of fear and anxiety, we urge our clergy and faith communities to speak and act boldly in solidarity with our people. As Cardinal Tobin shared with us, sometimes our faith leaders need to walk out in front and show that they are not afraid either. We ask our Catholic Bishops to write a covenant that spells out specific actions that dioceses and parishes should take to protect families in the areas of immigration, racism, jobs, housing, and the environment.

4. One People, One Fight: We commit to break down the walls that divide our struggles. We will not let corporate and political elites pit us against each other. We are in one fight to rebuild a society in which every person is seen as fully human, has a full voice in the decisions that shape their lives and is able to thrive and reach their human potential.

5. International Week of Action May 1-7, 2017: We are calling on people in the U.S. and across the globe to stand together against hatred and attacks on families during a week of action May 1-7, 2017.

6. State and regional meetings of popular movements: We propose meetings of popular movements in each of our states over the next six months to bring this statement, the vision of the World Meetings and the Pope's message of hope and courage to every community in the United States.

7. Popular education: We propose to develop a shared curriculum and popular education program to equip people with analysis and tools to transform the world. We will focus on the development and leadership of young people. We will draw on the wisdom of our faith and cultural traditions, including Catholic Social Teaching. We recognize that our spiritual and political selves are inseparable. We have a moral obligation to confront and disrupt injustice.

8. Political power: To defend our families and protect our values we must build political power. We must change the electorate to reflect our communities, through massive efforts to reach out to tens of millions of voters who are ignored and taken for granted by candidates and parties. We must hold elected officials accountable to the common good and encourage people in our communities to take leadership themselves, including running for office, so that we can govern the communities in which we live.

LA ASCENSIÓN DEL SEÑOR

La Carta a los Efesios nos ofrece precisamente lo que las comunidades presentes necesitan de pedir al Señor resucitado. Jesús está listo para partir al lugar de donde vino. Deja su misión encomendada a unos cuantos, un grupo muy pequeño. El tiempo de trabajar ha llegado ahora solo falta que "Les ilumine la mente para que comprendan cuál es la esperanza que les da su llamamiento" (Ef 1, 18). Todos los bautizados somos llamados a trabajar por esta misión que aparentemente es sencilla, pero, que, es trabajo de toda la vida. ¡Dar a conocer el reino de Dios! Siendo testigos de ese amor que habita en el interior de cada persona y dando testimonio de eso que creemos.

La Ascensión del Señor, nos dice el Papa Francisco, "Nos hace conocer esta realidad tan consoladora para nuestro camino: en Cristo, verdadero Dios y verdadero hombre, nuestra humanidad ha sido llevada junto a Dios; Él nos abrió el camino; Él es como un jefe de cordada cuando se escala una montaña, que ha llegado a la cima y nos atrae hacia sí conduciéndonos a Dios. Si confiamos en Él nuestra vida, si nos dejamos guiar por Él, estamos ciertos de hallarnos en manos seguras, en manos de nuestro salvador, de nuestro abogado" (Audiencia general, 17 de abril de 2013). ¿Creemos esto que nos dice el Papa Francisco sobre Jesús? ¿Cómo debo responder ahora? Ojalá que escojamos ser cada día fieles discípulos en el lugar donde estemos, ya sea como padres y madres de familia, como estudiantes, como inmigrantes fieles a nuestras tradiciones de fe y cultura; confiando en las palabras de Jesús, "Yo estaré con ustedes todos los días, hasta el fin del mundo" (Mt 28, 20).

LA ASCENSIÓN DEL SEÑOR


La buena noticia de la Ascensión del Señor es que él regresa al lugar correcto donde siempre había estado: "a la derecha del Padre". Y es desde ahí que nos prepara un lugar a cada uno de nosotros. La glorificación de Cristo es el misterio de la Ascensión, y mediante ésta nos remite a la exaltación del Hijo de Dios. En este sentido Jesús ha sido constituido Señor de los Señores, participando en el poder y la autoridad del mismo Dios. Los discípulos se quedan desorientados y abandonados viendo al cielo. ¿Ahora qué va a pasar? Pero Jesús no los abandona, sino que su eterna presencia se queda entre nosotros a través del Espíritu Santo: "Yo estaré con ustedes todos los días, hasta el fin del mundo" (Mt 28, 20).

No se vale quedarnos mirándonos sin construir cada uno de nosotros nuestra propia responsabilidad como cristianos. La sociedad de hoy tiene mucho por hacer y debe ser impulsada con las mismas palabras de los ángeles de aquel día de la ascensión: "Galileos, ¿qué hacen allí parados, mirando al cielo?" (Hch 1, 11). Los cristianos no estamos llamados a ser espectadores pasivos. Tenemos una misión que cumplir: la tarea firme de hacer discípulos para así continuar la obra de Jesús. Aunque debemos de reconocer que muchas veces nos encontramos en la situación de aquellos discípulos. También nosotros estamos en tiempo de tensión: ellos estaban entre la Ascensión y Pentecostés; nosotros estamos entre Pentecostés y la segunda venida de Jesús. ¿Cómo vivimos este tiempo de espera? ¿Mirando hacia el cielo sin hacer nada o proclamando la Palabra de Dios? El Papa Francisco nos invita a ser cristianos de esperanza viviendo el gozo del Evangelio con alegría en medio de nuestro diario vivir.
