





MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGÉLIO – ALENTAR UN ENTENDIMIENTO MÁS PROFUNDO DE LA ESCRITURA

26 de abril de 2020 3er Domingo de Pascua

Continúa la alegría y el ambiente pascual; el aroma de las flores, la pila bautismal y el Cirio Pascual que nos alumbra en cada celebración de la Eucaristía. Su presencia disipa toda duda y oscuridad. La antífona de entrada que ilumina la alabanza de los fieles: "Aclama a Dios, tierra entera. Canten todo un himno a su nombre. Denle gracias y alábenlo. Aleluya." La narración del Evangelio de San Lucas que invita a dejar la ceguera para vivir en la luz de Cristo; abandonando la incredulidad, profesando una fe firme en el Resucitado. Júbilo total en este Tercer Domingo de Pascua.

En el relato del camino de Emaús, Jesús se aparece a sus desanimados discípulos haciéndose el desconocido. En el camino, les explica las Escrituras y luego a su invitación de quedarse con ellos porque ya cae la tarde, se sienta a la mesa, toma el pan y lo bendice, lo parte y al dárselo a ellos desaparece. Entonces el sentimiento aflora en ellos y se dicen: "¡Con razón nuestro corazón ardía, mientras nos hablaba por el camino y nos explicaba las Escrituras!" (Lucas 24:32). ¿Reconocemos a Jesús cuando camina con nosotros? ¿Sabemos cuándo parte el pan y nos lo da? Por último, ¿Cuándo arde nuestro corazón al escuchar las Escrituras? Son simples preguntas que llevan a una conversión penetrante si se profundiza en ellas. En esta línea se mueven las lecturas de hoy; confirmar la fe y la esperanza. Acercarse al nuevo comienzo de la Pascua es lo esencial. Jesús categuiza y evangeliza, a la misma vez, a sus desalentados discípulos. Quita su ceguera haciéndoles ver como las Escrituras habían anunciado ese escándalo de la Cruz. ¡Aleluya!

April 15 2020 Corona virus Letter To Humanity

The earth whispered but you did not hear.

I've made you stop thinking about materialistic things. Now you


are like the earth...

Justice Matters – an interfaith network working for justice

Justice Matters Legal Action is a Voting Rights Issue

The County Commission could decide to follow state law at any time and give Douglas County Citizens the state-designated right to petition to put the issue of jail expansion on the ballot. If they do, citizens need to be prepared to collect 2,500 signatures in less than 30 days. So Justice Matters is launching a "petitionreadiness" drive to collect pledges to sign the petition when it becomes available.

Danielle Rudes, PhD, from the George Mason University's Center for Achieving Academic Excellence was hired by Justice Matters to research available alternatives to incarceration in Douglas County. Members of the Jail Alternatives Steering

Committee Zoomed with Dr. Rudes to discuss her findings. Two noteworthy comments from the study include:

- 1. The crime rate with the exception of a minor uptick in violent crime – is down in Douglas County.
- 2. Jails are not rehabilitative environments.

Solving Homelessness and the need for Landlords Now

The Douglas County Commission approved a contract last week to become a "Built for Zero" community (i.e., eliminating homelessness). This is a tremendous first step taken by the County Commission. The Homelessness Committee remains committed to ensure this process is fully embraced.

New issues have arisen due to COVID-19 as the streets and shelters are some of the worst places to be during an outbreak of a highly-contagious virus. Local service providers are confident that there will be some financial assistance available for Housing First.

Justice Matters can help by identifying landlords with vacant rental units. If you are a landlord with a vacant property please consider talking with a housing service provider about potential tenants who have the ability to pay rent. Just text the number 202-410-4202 and put "landlord" in the body of the text. Your info will be passed onto service providers like Family Promise and Bert Nash and they will discuss possibilities within your comfort level. 




