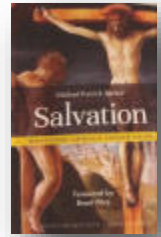
WELCOME, FATHER FRANCISCO

NEW CLASS WITH FATHER BARNABAS

This Spring I will offer a short series of classes on the topic of salvation. I am sure many of you have been asked by evangelical friends and acquaintances "Are you saved? Or "have you been born again?" Salvation or "justification" is an issue that has divided Catholics and non-Catholics since the reformation some 500 years ago. We will take a look at the different answers given by Catholics and non-Catholics to the question of salvation of how we are made right before God—that is "justified" before God. You will learn in this class that Catholics and non-Catholics are not as far apart as you might think. You will be better equipped to hold an informed conversation with others on the complex and fascinating subject of salvation. The class will provide you with plenty of opportunities to reflect on your relationship with the Lord this Lenten season. We will be going through the "Joint Declaration on the Doctrine of Justification" created and agreed to by the Catholic Church's pontifical council for promoting Christian Unity and the Lutheran World Federation in 1999. We will also be looking at the book *Salvation* by Michael Barber. **Saturday** classes are at **9:00 am** and the **Tuesday** encore classes are at **7:00 pm**. JUSTICE MATTERS

Justice Matters – an interfaith network working for justice

A new associate organizer of Justice Matters has been assigned to St. John's Justice Matters ministry. Her name is Katie Hobson, a member of Peace Mennonite Church, who has contributed the following message on homelessness and an invitation to our parish network meeting on **February 29**.

Just a few months ago during the annual fall listening process, faith communities across Douglas County came together to discuss weighty issues in our city and in our county that keep us up at night. This process revealed an overwhelming concern for those who do not have homes, especially in light of the Lawrence Community Shelter having to reduce capacity due to funding and staffing shortages.

It is no surprise that Homelessness was adopted at the Community Problems Assembly as a system in our county in need of serious change. Since that time, the research committee has met with the following local and national experts in order to identify the gaps in our current system:

- Family Promise
- Tenants to Homeowners
- Bert Nash Homeless Outreach Team
- Participated in the point in time count
- Just Food
- Greater Kansas City Coalition to End Homelessness
- Lawrence Coalition for Homeless Concerns
- Lawrence Community Shelter
- DARE Center
- Lawrence Public Library Community Resource Specialist

- Homeless Coordinator in Rockford, IL (first community to reach functional zero for chronically homeless and vets)



Functional Zero. You read that correctly. There are communities in the United States who have reached functional zero in chronic homelessness. This means that they have expanded their thinking to imagine a community without homelessness and actually created capacity to house everyone who is homeless. Our research team is currently engaged in learning more about these communities and how to bring the model of functional zero to Douglas County.

St. John's is no stranger to the homeless population in Lawrence, as evidenced by all kinds of services you provide directly (such as Catholic Charities and the Rummage House) to those you do in partnership with the greater community (such as Family Promise, Habitat for Humanity and LINK). These services are just one piece of the puzzle.

Not everyone can be involved in the research, but as many of you have shared, we do all have a role to play in our community. To learn more about how we can get our city to Functional Zero, please join us for our **St. John Parish Network Meeting in the church basement on February 29 from 2:30 - 4:00 pm**.

There will also be additional informational meetings about the homeless situation in Lawrence on **Monday, March 2, at 7:15 pm in the Bosco Room of the school** and on **Saturday, March 7, at 2:15 pm in the church basement** with Loring Henderson, director of DARE.

RULES

- Boards are placed 27 feet from front edge to front edge
- Games are played to 21 points
- **Woody:** Refers to any cornhole bag that has been pitched and remains on the cornhole board playing surface at the conclusion of each frame. Each woody is 1 point.
- **Cornhole:** Refers to any cornhole bag that has been pitched and passes through the cornhole board hole at anytime with the frame. Each cornhole is 3 points.
- A bag that comes to rest touching the ground AND the board does not count as a point.
- **Cancellation scoring:** The approved method of scoring for the sport of cornhole is "cancellation" scoring. In cancellation scoring, the points of one player cancel out the points of their opponent. Using this method, only one player/team can score in each frame.
- Both players play one board at a time, and stay in their designated lane for the whole game (right or left).
- Players then walk to the end of their lane to the end of the other board, take score, and resume pitching back to the other cornhole board.
- Players must deliver their bags with an underhand release.
- Feet must stay behind the line of the front of the board at the time of releasing the bag.
- The player/team who scored in the preceding frame pitches first in the next frame. If neither player/team scores, the player/team who pitched first in the preceding frame shall retain first pitch in the next frame.
- If bags become piled inside the cornhole board hole and may interfere or obstruct with the next pitch or if there is a question whether a cornhole bag would have naturally fallen through the hole, a player may request to "rake" the cornhole bags that have fallen inside the hole.


