

NEW CLASS WITH FATHER BARNABAS

This Spring I will offer a short series of classes on the topic of salvation. I am sure many of you have been asked by evangelical friends and acquaintances "Are you saved? Or "have you been born again?" Salvation or "justification" is an issue that has divided Catholics and non-Catholics since the reformation some 500 years ago. We will take a look at the different answers given by Catholics and non-Catholics to the



question of salvation of how we are made right before Godthat is "justified" before God. You will learn in this class that Catholics and non-Catholics are not as far apart as you might think. You will be better equipped to hold an informed conversation with others on the complex and fascinating subject of salvation. The class will provide you with plenty of opportunities to reflect on your relationship with the Lord this Lenten season. We will be going through the "Joint Declaration on the Doctrine of Justification" created and agreed to by the Catholic Church's pontifical council for promoting Christian Unity and the Lutheran World Federation in 1999. St. John's NETWORK MEETING February 29 from 2:30-4:00 pm. Each member faith community will hold a Network Meeting to give Network Members updates on our research and to plan for powerful turnout to the Nehemiah Assembly. The meeting will be in the church basement.

Homelessness in Lawrence – a discussion. This is an urgent situation with nearly 400 in the recent count of who is without shelter. SOCIAL JUSTICE SOCIAL ACTION

omelessness and affordable housing have been issues recently in our local community. But what does church teaching have to say about them?

First of all, they are prominently featured in Biblical history. At his birth, Jesus and his parents experienced homelessness; there was no room for them in the inn and Jesus was born in a manger. The family was soon on the run from a king determined to kill Jesus; again, they were homeless, and immigrants.

And in the Old Testament, there was the wandering in the desert for 40 years and the long, long exile from the home of the Jews, Israel.

In the Church's document "What Have You Done to Your Homeless Brother?", the USCCB document on economic justice from 1975 and the USCCB document "Homelessness and Housing" from 1988, public housing is put forward as a basic human right. Decent housing for all demonstrates a society's commitment to a respect for all life and the dignity of the human person, both principles of Catholic social teaching.

From "Homelessness and Housing": "We also bring to this discussion other important values drawn from our social teaching: principles of stewardship, participation, and a preferential option for the poor and vulnerable. Stewardship calls us to use the gifts of God's creation for the benefit of all and raises basic questions of equality, fairness, and justice. Participation suggests that we measure our progress by whether people are able to shape their own destiny and meet their own basic needs by a broader participation in economic, civic, and social life. The preferential option for the poor restates the biblical lesson that we shall be judged by our response to "the least among us," that the quality of justice is best measured by how the poor and most vulnerable are faring. The Church needs to share this teaching more broadly and educate about the reality of homelessness and poor housing in our midst."

"Our shelters tell us the numbers are growing; the pressures are increasing; our resources are being stretched to the breaking point. Our shelter activities, by themselves, are an inadequate response to the need. We fear we are developing a new and often dehumanizing way of caring for the poorest among us, a strategy of isolating homeless people in often primitive shelters."

Justice Matters and the social concerns for peace and justice committee are co-sponsoring a Lenten forum on homelessness. It will be offered twice so you can find a time to fit your schedule: on Monday, March 2 at 7:15 pm in the Bosco Room in the basement of St. John School, and on Saturday, March 7, at 2:15 pm in the basement of St. John Church. Speakers will address meeting the challenges that this issue poses for us as a community and as Catholic Christians. Please plan on enriching your Lenten journey by attending one of these forums.

- Boards are placed 27 feet from front edge to front edge
- Games are played to 21 points
- Woody: Refers to any cornhole bag that has been pitched and remains on the cornhole board playing surface
 a the conclusion of each frame. Each woody is 1 point.
- Cornhole: Refers to any cornhole bag that has been pitched and passes through the cornhole board hole at
 anytime with the frame. Each cornhole is 3 points.
- A bag that comes to rest touching the ground AND the board does not count as a point.
- Cancellation scoring: The approved method of scoring for the sport of cornhole is "cancellation" scoring. In
 cancellation scoring, the points of one player cancel out the points of their opponent. Using this method, only one
 player/team can score in each frame.
- Both players play one board at a time, and stay in their designated lane for the whole game (right or left).
- Players then walk to the end of their lane to the end of the other board, take score, and resume pitching back to the
 other cornhole board.
- Players must deliver their bags with an underhand release.
- Feet must stay behind the line of the front of the board at the time of releasing the bag.
- The player/team who scored in the preceding frame pitches first in the next frame. If neither player/team scores, the
 player/team who pitched first in the preceding frame shall retain first pitch in the next frame.
- If bags become piled inside the cornhole board hole and may interfere or obstruct with the next pitch or if there is a
 question whether a cornhole bag would have naturally fallen through the hole, a player may request to "rake" the
 cornhole bags that have fallen inside the hole.
