
STUCO'S CHOSEN CHARITY FOR THE NEXT FEW WEEKS

NEW CLASS WITH FATHER BARNABAS



SOCIAL JUSTICE SOCIAL ACTION

he evening prior to writing this column, I was on a conference call meeting of the national Justice, Peace and Integrity of Creation Advisory Council of the Secular Franciscan Order. One of my colleagues on that committee was providing some formation for us on the intersection between discipleship, courage and social action.

Another colleague then told us about a group called Meta Peace Team in Michigan. This group educates people about nonviolent solutions to conflicts and also "walks that walk." The team has literally stood between a line of drug cartel members in Mexico and a line of immigrants and conducted a nonviolent peacemaking/building intervention. They have literally stood between groups of combatants in the Middle East and have

conducted a nonviolent peacemaking intervention.

In the past forty years or so that they have been intervening in conflict-ridden situations, many of them with a history of violence, Meta Peace Team members have not been shot or otherwise harmed. And we got to talking about the many risks that Christians and many other groups take in openly practicing their faith and doing what their beliefs call them to do.

And what do many of us risk in living out our faith? Ridicule! We are afraid of ridicule. Others in persecuted and marginalized groups around the world risk losing their lives, risk losing their families; and I risk ridicule!

The next time I worry about ridicule when doing something I feel called to do, I will remember others in our world today and others who have gone before us who risked their very lives for their beliefs. What faith! What courage!

JUSTICE MATTERS

Justice Matters – an interfaith network working for justice

ustice Matters stands in opposition to a massive jail expansion in Douglas County because we believe that it would be better to address issues that cause people to be incarcerated instead of building more cells. Although we are an interfaith organization our beliefs are summed up in not only biblical imperatives but also in Catholic Social Teaching. I encourage you to read the Catholic Bishops' statement on mass incarceration, Responsibility, Rehabilitation, and Restoration: A Catholic Perspective on Crime and Criminal Justice. Three primary Catholic Social Teaching core concepts that are directly linked to the criminal justice system and incarceration:

Human Dignity

The human dignity of all persons is rooted in our common creation in the image and likeness of God. Neither crime nor criminal sentence can change this. Human dignity sets a high standard for the treatment of those currently and formerly behind bars as well as their families.

Common Good

Justice demands that our actions are oriented toward the good of all, excluding no one. To pursue the common good, we must work to ensure that all persons can participate and flourish in the community. By its very design, incarceration marginalizes and makes it a challenge to see incarcerated persons as full members of the community. Even after incarceration, marginalization persists. The common good requires us to actively promote one another's flourishing, without exceptions.

Option for the Poor

The option for the poor draws our attention to those who are the most vulnerable. For any social issue, we must ask who will bear the greatest burden, who lacks a voice, and who is most susceptible to harm. The poor and marginalized are always and everywhere to be prioritized.

The preferential option for the poor directs our attention to all those impacted by incarceration. In particular, it demands an urgent and prophetic response to the ways that incarceration reveals and creates racial and economic injustice.




