



Chris Alar, MIC. The evening will begin with Mass, followed by small group discussion facilitated by Catholic counselors. The evening will end with prayer. The program will be held at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Shawnee on **January 14 and 21** from **7:00 pm to 8:30 pm**. Adults and teens, accompanied by a parent, are welcome. ## JUSTICE MATTERS

#### Justice Matters - an interfaith network working for justice

Alice Hewitt is one of the St. John's Justice Matters network members who attended the December 14 Research kick off. Following is her summary and call to action.

Justice Matters is promoting Restorative Practices in Lawrence Schools. One of the issues that was discussed at the December 14 research kick off for Justice Matters was restorative practices. If you are interested in learning more there will be a RESTORATIVE JUSTICE IN SCHOOLS COMMITTEE MEETING - Sunday, January 12, 1:30-3:00 pm, Plymouth Congregational Church.

In Time magazine recently there was an article about a student that brought a shotgun with one shell into a school in Oregon. The student encountered a coach who grabbed the gun, opened his arms and told the student that he cared about him. The student looked very surprised and said, you do? The coach embraced the student, and the crisis was resolved. The one shell had been intended for himself.

Historically schools have relied on punitive discipline policies that sends disruptive students to detention, or for more serious violations the student is suspended from school. The student is removed from the learning environment and is more likely to fall behind in their schoolwork.

The restorative practices approach gives students the chance to talk about the problem with teachers, counselors, or their peers. They develop skills to manage their emotions and actions.

Students who are expected to figure out how to make amends for their mistakes learn to take responsibility for their actions. A more positive climate allows for greater attention to academics, boosting student performance. Students who are guided in talking through the harm in their actions have caused develop a greater sense of empathy and start to think before they act. During the holiday season we sang "Peace on earth. Good will towards men." Let those words settle into you all year long. Then join in the work of helping our schools become better.
