

How the Coronavirus Relief Law Helps **RETIREMENT SAVERS AND RETIREES**

What can you tell me about the retirement account changes that Congress recently passed in response to the coronavirus crisis?

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, or CARES Act, was signed into law by President Trump in late March. Tucked inside were a series of changes that can help retirement savers. These changes can help those in need of cash, as well as help preserve the retirement savings accounts of current retirees while the stock market is down. Here is a rundown of how three provisions in the CARES Act might help you or someone you know.

HARDSHIP WITHDRAWALS

Normally, if you took money out of an employer-sponsored retirement plan or IRA before 59, you would be hit with taxes plus a 10% tax penalty on that amount. The CARES Act waives the early distribution penalty on up to \$100,000 of distributions in 2020 for "affected individuals." You must still pay income taxes on any amounts withdrawn, but the new law allows you to pay the taxes over three years. Additionally, if you recontribute the amount withdrawn back into your plan within three years, that amount will not be taxed.

To qualify for this penalty-free hardship withdrawal, you, your spouse or a dependent must have been diagnosed with coronavirus (COVID-19) or have experienced adverse financial consequences as a result of COVID-19. This includes being guarantined, furloughed, laid off, having work hours reduced, being unable to work due to a lack of child care due to COVID-19 or



closing or reducing hours of a business you owned or operated if you had COVID-19.

BIGGER LOANS

The CARES Act will also allow you to take larger loans against the money you have saved in your 401(k) or 403(b) during the six-month period after the law was implemented on March 27, 2020. IRAs do not allow loans.

Normally, you can borrow only up to \$50,000 or 50% of your vested account balance, whichever is less. The CARES Act doubles that amount - up to \$100,000 against the amount you have saved in your plan.

Borrowers typically have five years to repay a loan or the amount will be treated as a distribution and taxed. But if you leave or lose your job, you may be required to pay the balance back early, you could owe taxes and you may face an early-withdrawal penalty.

This provision also helps those with an existing 401(k) loan by allowing them to delay repayments that are due in 2020 for one year.

Suspended RMDs

Beginning in 2020, individuals who turn 70 after January 1, 2020 are required to take annual mandatory distributions from their tax-deferred 401(k)s and IRAs when they reach age 72. In prior years, the age of required distributions kicked in when savers turned 70 years of age. This requirement is known as the required minimum distribution or RMD.

The CARES Act suspends RMDs for 2020, including those for inherited IRAs. This means you can skip taking a distribution this year if you wish.

The temporary waiver of RMDs will help retirees who would otherwise have been forced to base their minimum. withdrawals for 2020 on their account balances as of Dec. 31, 2019, when the stock market was near record levels. It will also give the market time to recover before resuming distributions in 2021.

As one of the speakers eloquently quoted Dr. Marin Luther King, Jr. as he explained why even as a new resident of Lawrence he had signed on to support the voters right case against Douglas County and the Jail Expansion, "Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere. We are caught in an inescapable network of mutuality, tied in a single garment of destiny. Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly."

SOCIAL JUSTICE SOCIAL ACTION

'm not sure how to talk about the climate issue in these times of crisis. I'll start by mentioning that as a member of Citizens Climate Lobby and the St. John Social Concerns for Peace and Justice Committee, I have come to understand that federal elected officials don't respond to our 5th or 6th most important issue. If climate is important enough to you to be a priority issue, your Congressman and Senators need to hear you state it that way.

Climate change is a life issue. We could probably connect it to racism too. Afterall, wealthy Americans will be the last ones impacted by climate change at a survival level.

Let us remember what Pope Francis is so urgently trying to teach us about our earthly home. Some of us think because we are conservative, middle of the road, or liberal we are exempted from his teachings because politics preempts spirituality. It is hard to ponder the creation of our world by our Lord and not understand that care for creation is a spirituality issue. For we are the stewards of our earth, God's Creation.

Francis exhorted us 5 years ago in his encyclical, Laudato Si (Care for our Common Home) to engage on the issue of climate. Everything is connected and we are pushing our planet to the brink. The impacts will first be felt by the poor. The first effects on Kansas poor will be heat and deluge. By midcentury we can expect 50-100 days above 100 degrees (currently 10-25) and 25-50 days above 105 degrees (currently 1-10). NOAA.

In honor of Laudato Si's fifth anniversary, Pope Francis has extended the celebration for another year. Many educational events are planned and requested. Parish involvement is desired. Our parish Social Concerns committee discussed

holding a set of programs on earth care as a life issue, possibly connecting it also with racism, but also possibly having separate training tracks. Let us know if you will participate. Nationally, Citizens Climate Lobby has decided that it would be best to push hard on our signature piece of legislation; carbon fee and dividend, aka The Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act (HB763) after Mitch McConnell is out of office. By the way, the Bishops support carbon fee and dividend legislation.

In the meantime, we are focusing on people. We support those impacted by reduced fossil energy, by endorsing a piece of legislation to transition Appalachian miners out of coal mines and into other work and to take care of their families with the Reclaim Act (HB2156). Also, The Growing Climate Solutions Act of 2020 in the Senate to help farmers and forest landowner participate in carbon credits markets. These offer us opportunities for better dialogue versus adversarial confrontation.

Laudato Si Ten takeaways

- 1) The spiritual perspective is now part of the discussion on the environment.
- 2) The poor are disproportionately affected by climate change.
- 3) Less is more.
- 4) Catholic social teaching now includes teaching on the environment.
- 5) Discussions about ecology can be grounded in the Bible and church tradition.
- 6) Everything is connected—including the economy.
- 7) Scientific research on the environment is to be praised and used.
- 8) Widespread indifference and selfishness worsen environmental problems.
- 9) Global dialogue and solidarity are needed.
- 10) A change of heart is required.




UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

There are many things of which we can be afraid: being rebuked, rejection, anger, being challenged, having to defend ourselves, standing alone, insecurity, failure, and even death. For some, identifying and overcoming their fears is a daunting task. Regardless of how much they may want to break the cycle of fear, they find that they remain close friends with old and dysfunctional behavioral habits and norms. Maybe what they really fear is change. There are many who gravitate to the familiar and comfortable, and find safety and security in doing so, even if they remain mired in mediocrity. Human beings have to learn that there is life beyond the "what has always been" and that happiness and depth are possible when old structures and systems have to be left behind.

Can you leave the near and dear, the comfortable and familiar, the safe and secure, and discover new opportunities? The shear thought of doing so can bring on feelings of apprehension, intense anger,

resentment, defensiveness, reluctance, resistance, and even apathy. If we have to be responsible for making the change, cowardice can creep in. If someone else is to blame for making the change, any number of possible negative reactions are possible. In the end, only one thing is required and that is God. If I can rely on and deepen my relationship with God, especially in the Eucharist along with a community of believers, then little else is of great concern. We have to figure out what is really important. It is not always what we think.

The Gospel calls us to stretch ourselves and try new things, not to remain stuck and stagnant in familiar ways. We are asked to live life more deliberately, radically, and intentionally. We are asked to leave the familiar behind and learn to live with changing, and often limiting, human structures. We cannot get too caught up in the physical, ideological, or structural systems we are used to. The Holy Spirit always leads and guides us. If we trust this, we will find ourselves doing things we never thought we



could do. Always seek the path to joy and love. They keep us from falling victim to our fears and from seeking the nostalgic crutches we think we need to achieve a sense of well-being and happiness.

Will You Say Yes?


You find yourself in the difficult situation of being accused of blasphemy and confronting possible execution. Your crime is believing in Jesus Christ. The question is then asked of you, "Are you a Christian, a follower of the one named Jesus Christ?" Your answer may very well dictate what happens to you next. What is your answer?

It is probably easier to answer this question when the scenario is makebelieve. All of us want to believe that we would say yes to the question of belief in Jesus, but strange things happen when humans panic in the face of extreme stress. As we reflect on what we would say, there are those all over

the world who are being asked that very same question. It is a question that was asked of many in the first centuries of the Church. Those who respond "yes" are considered martyrs and saints.

We might not usually think of all this in terms of good stewardship

living. However, our faith is also a gift we have received from God to cultivate, grow, and share with others. The more interesting question than the one posed above is, "Would an accuser even think of asking you such a question?" Would you have cultivated, grown, and shared your faith enough that anyone would even consider you worthy of



asking the question? They might assume you don't know Jesus Christ at all. I don't like conflict and do not seek out conflict, but I would rather someone ask the first question posed than assume there is no reason to confront me in the first place.


