A LETTER FROM ST. JOHN PRINCIPAL

October 16th, 2020

RE: Reopening of St. John

SCHOOL MISSION *Faith-Knowledge- Service-Growth*

All St. John Catholic School students will be challenged to grow in their faith and knowledge, learn to show respect and compassion for themselves and others, and live their beliefs through service in their community and the world.

The school has begun a phased-in reopening plan. On October 5th, the preschool and kindergarten returned to school. Preschool is naturally hybrid because students are in small groups and there are two separate sections. Kindergarten was split into two groups in two separate classrooms and is operating in a hybrid fashion. Preschool is in session five days a week and Kindergarten attends in person Monday-Thursday and has remote learning on Friday.

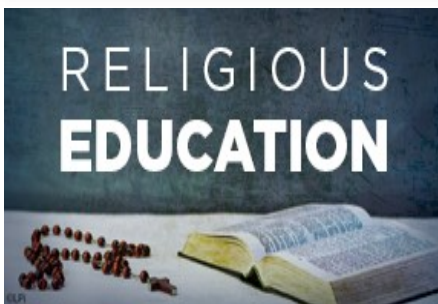
On October 19th, 1st-5th grade will return to the building. After surveying our school families, we assessed the number of students who would continue with the virtual learning platform and those who preferred to return in a hybrid or in-person format. We also undertook a careful assessment of our building's floor plan and available space and made adjustments to accommodate for different class sizes and allow for adequate social distancing for all students in attendance. The number of students anticipated to return in-person is within the recommended cohort size for each individual class, and this will allow us to resume an in-person option Monday-Thursday. Fridays will be used for teachers' office hours and electives.

If all goes well, middle school students will return to the building on November 2nd following the same protocols as K-5th grade.

All classrooms will have students spaced 6 feet apart with a personal barrier on the desk. Each student and teacher will be wearing a mask all day except when eating or drinking.

At this time, the county is in Yellow on the Douglas county gating criteria. This is why we are moving forward with our plans to reopen. If we are to move to Orange or Red, we would move the entire school back to remote learning. If the gated criteria moved to Green, we would still continue with the reopening path we have created.

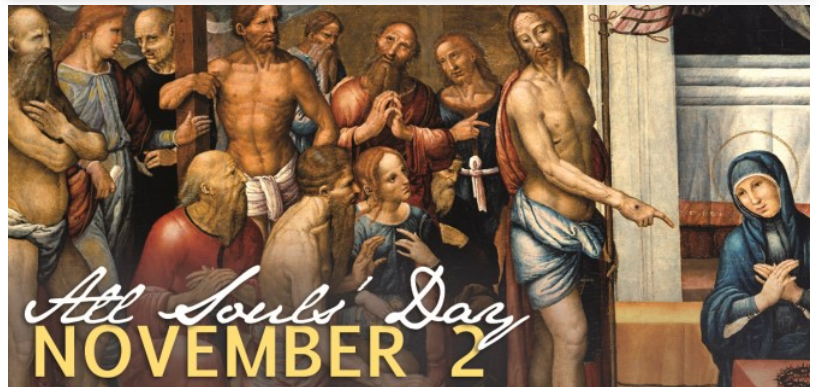

Dear Friends of St. John,

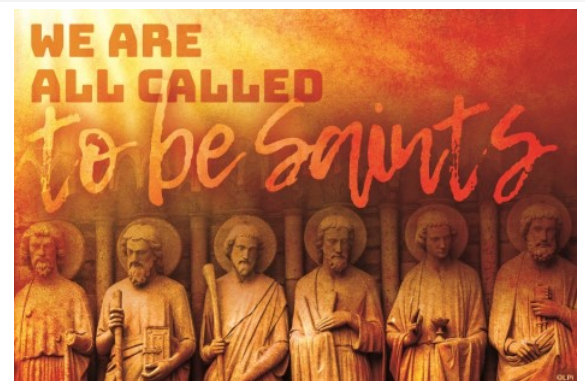

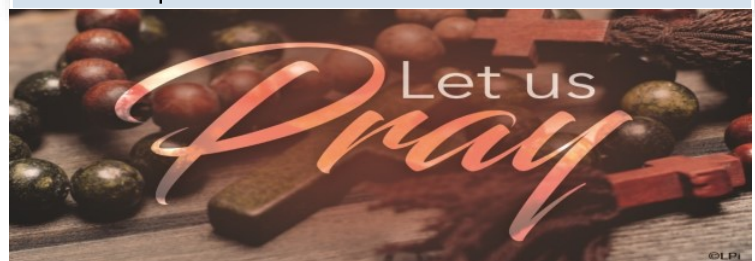

At this writing, the results of the November 3 election are not known. It feels strange to think that as you're reading this, the results will be known.

Part, if not most, of the work for justice is to make needed changes happen, or to advocate for the maintenance and growth of needed services, programs and policies. Our local community is blessed to have available contacts for programs that help create and grow needed change on a local and national level.

Locally, Justice Matters is a major player in identifying and working for needed changes. The League of Women Voters also keeps a finger on the pulse of local issues (and, by the way, mean may chain; they're co-ed now.) You may also want to get on a city, county or non-profit board of directors. They often help research issues and are looked to for guidance by lawmakers. Many state organizations also have places for public or at-large representation on their boards. Some of them require a governor's appointment and involve an application process. The application and any other gathered information gathered from you by the agency whose board it is are given to the governor's office with recommendations from the agency and the appointments are made.

The City of Lawrence and the Douglas County websites have lists

of boards on their sites and they are often looking for membership.

Change takes place on a local, state and global level. There are many, many spokes in the wheels of change and other social justice action. The spokes are the intentional groups and people who work so hard to make our country and world work. They are made up of diverse people with diverse opinions. As Catholic Christians, we can and are called, as people of Christ, to be active in making our world the way we want it to be. And there is power in numbers. Find the place where you fit and use your experience to be use the way you live and work as a witness for Christ! You never know when something you do or say may inspire somebody to want what you have spiritually. And always pray!

All Saints Day: November 1, 2020

I remember as a child the meticulousness my father would bring to a task. All of the saints in heaven and on earth form this cloud of witnesses who journey with us as we make our way through life. They offer us inspiration, wisdom, intercession, and support. They direct us toward true happiness and remind us that we are all called to be saints. All it takes is desire, love, and fidelity. There is much we can learn from the official saints of the church. Their guidance is ever before us and ever with us. But there is also a lot to learn from the unofficial saints of the church. They sit beside us every Sunday, are our neighbors and ordinary people we meet every day. Because of the devotedness of their faith, they remind us to keep going, remain focused, and cultivate purpose and meaning, and give voice to those who have none. The inspiration is all around us.

Pay attention to the details. Do what you do with great love. Know that you are not alone. Believe that you can persevere. Have great faith.
