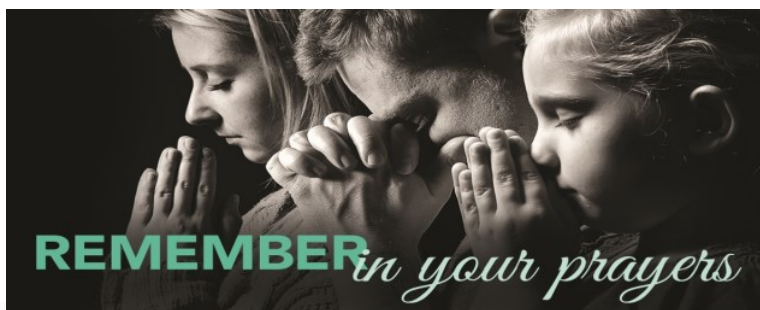

# FOCUS ON THE WORD

## ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

God gives us the gift of His very self and asks us to invest it. Investing God's greatest gift of Himself wisely, allows God's kingdom to grow and flourish. God trusts us with this pearl of great price in hopes that it will produce abundant fruit. While God's gift of self is realized in the gifts of faith, hope, and love, they are not meant to be solely for personal benefit. They are intended to be shared and are at the heart of Jesus' blueprint for happiness, the Beatitudes.

When we properly invest God's greatest gift, His most treasured possession, we invest in the wellbeing of all of our brothers and sisters and the world in which we live. We take up most seriously our call to be stewards and properly manage, not only our own affairs, but the affairs of those around and before us. God has put tremendous confidence in us. Do we have that same confidence in God?

We often go the extra mile and put in the additional effort when it comes to those concerns closest to us: our families, friends, careers, home and securities. But when it comes to things that are not as close to us, we can become lax and less conscientious. Tending to God's treasure requires a great deal of focus and persistent hard work. It demands that I see the bigger picture, God's picture, in which self-sacrifice is a given as we labor for the establishment of God's kingdom, God's vision. Fear and a lack of trust can loom large, however. We are afraid of letting go of what is "mine" and apprehensive of jeopardizing what we have in order to venture into something bigger and more promising.



Fear and a lack of trust serve no purpose in God's kingdom. They benefit neither the person nor God. What is required is a courageous resolve that produces the fortitude necessary to stay the course and do what God is asking. Doing all in our power to cultivate the seeds of faith, hope, and love in our world, working diligently to put all of our relationships in proper order, becoming attentive to systems and ideologies that hurt and oppress people, being mindful of injustice, and laboring on behalf of the poor and the needy are at the core of what each of us is asked to do. It is how we invest God's most precious gift wisely. If persistent, alert and attentive, then life will gradually improve around us, there will be greater peace and we will experience joy.

I say Yes. What did we do when we were little children and were tired? And what do our kids do when they're tired? They go to a parent for comfort and for relief.

Maybe it's time for us to run to God our Father. Maybe it's time

for us to let him hold us in his loving arms; to reassure us, and through his embrace and his words to us as we beg for peace, joy and hope, to be strengthened again into hope and energized again for whatever is ahead for us, and will again equip for the justice work that needs to be done in our world and for doing the works of mercy that face us.

Advent, though, is an especially good time as it is full of hopeful anticipation along with cultivating the patience needed for the wait, as we joyfully anticipate the celebration of the joyful birth of Jesus Christ and the hope he brings to us.

## APPRAISING OUR GREATEST VALUABLES

The Antiques Roadshow has been one of the most popular programs on public television over the past twenty-five years. The show follows experts as they go around the country appraising the antiques of ordinary people. It is a delight to watch the surprise on their faces when they learn that something they purchased for a few dollars at a yard sale is really worth thousands. It makes us wonder what treasures we may have stored in our attics or basements.

In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus tells the story of three men who are entrusted with a treasure by their king. Though the king is gone only a short time, two of the men are able to double their money by investing it. Why were they so successful? First, they recognized the value of the treasure and knew that the best use of it was to invest it. Second, they understood that the treasure belonged to the king and not to them, and that they would have to give it back. They were not willing to let the treasure gather dust, unlike the third man who buried his talent in the ground out of fear.

Jesus' meaning could not be clearer. God

has entrusted a treasure to us, and He expects us to make good use of it. During this week, we should examine our consciences to determine what that treasure is and how we can multiply it for the glory of God. Today's first reading, however, suggests to us a treasure which all of us have and which we can so often take for granted, like valuable antiques gathering dust in our attics — our family.

The first reading from the book of Proverbs is a poem praising a good wife whose "value is beyond pearls." Pearls were among the scarcest and most valuable items in the ancient world. In essence, the poem is saying that there is nothing more valuable than a good wife. By extension, our families are one of the most valuable treasures entrusted to us by God.

It is often said that charity begins at home. The home is a school where children are taught to love and serve God. Whether we are parents or children, the home is the place where we learn to become holy. In fact, families which eat at least one meal together daily, pray, and go to Mass together, have practically a zero percent divorce rate. Our homes must be places where God is honored if our marriages are



to be strong and our children are to grow in virtue. And that means they must be more than just the place where we eat and sleep in between our jobs, our classes, and our other activities. Our homes must be the place where we pray, where we come to love and understand each other, and where we practice kindness and generosity.

Our family is among the treasures God has given us for our enjoyment and for his glory. The way a valuable antique can get lost in the clutter of our attics, our loved ones can get overlooked because of the hectic pace of modern life. If we are wondering what special gifts God has given us and how we should be investing our time and energy, perhaps we have to look no further than our own homes.

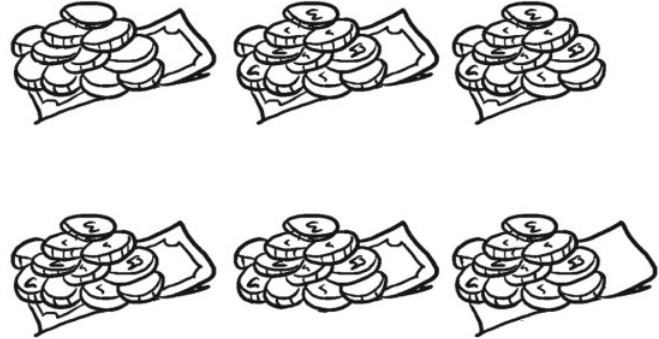

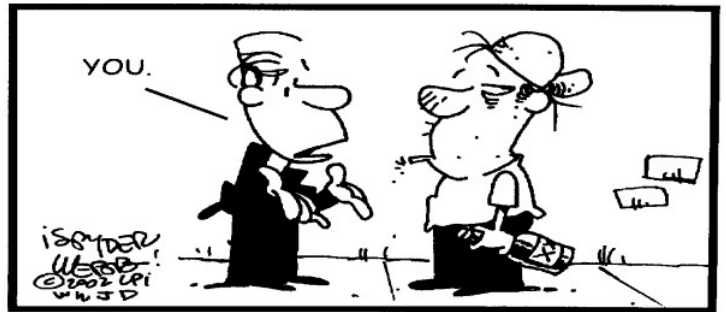

De acuerdo al Evangelio, dos de los servidores hicieron muy bien. Sin embargo, el tercero no se preocupó en lo absoluto de poner a trabajar lo recibido. "Es importante no encerrarse en sí mismos, enterrando el propio talento, las propias riquezas espirituales, intelectuales, materiales, todo lo que el Señor nos ha dado, sino abrirse, ser solidarios, tener cuidado de los demás". ¿Han pensado en los talentos que Dios les ha dado? ¿Han pensado en cómo se pueden poner al servicio de los demás? ¿No entierren los talentos! Apuesten por grandes ideales, los ideales que agrandan el corazón, aquellos ideales de servicio que harán fructíferos sus talentos". La vida no se nos ha dado para que la conservemos celosamente para nosotros mismos, sino que se nos ha dado, para que la donemos. ¡Queridos jóvenes, tengan un corazón grande! ¡No tengan miedo de soñar cosas grandes!" Y añadió el Papa. "Nos dice que la espera del retorno del Señor es el tiempo de la acción. Nosotros somos el tiempo de la acción, tiempo para sacar provecho de los dones de Dios. 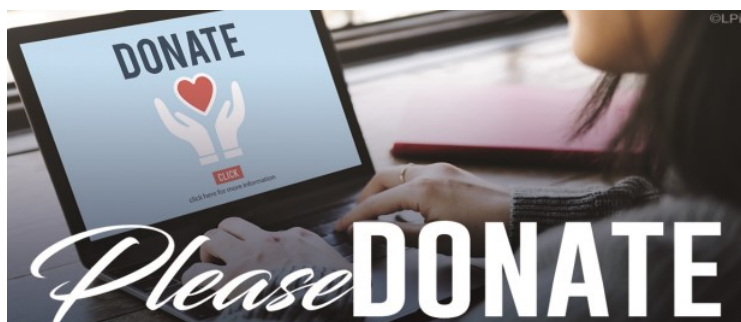

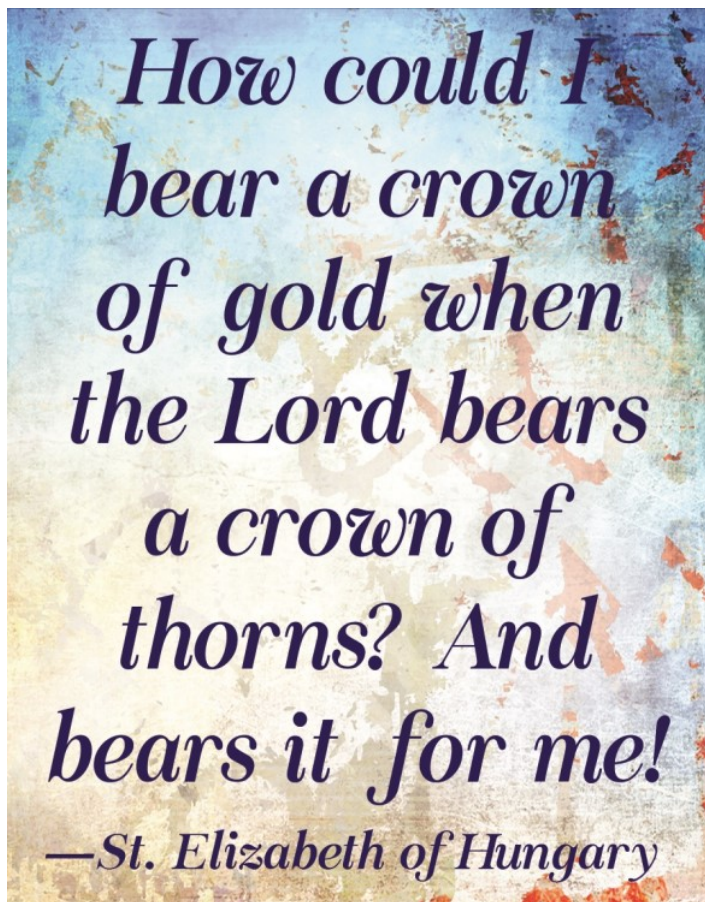
