

GOD GIVES US AN INVITATION TO HAVE AN ABUNDANT LIFE

Nobody enjoys paying taxes. Despite our displeasure in being forced to do so, we also realize that the monies generated from taxes allows governments to provide essential services for its people. Corruption really gets our goat, however. When we witness malfeasance, overspending, irresponsibility, and dishonesty in governmental spending, the grave injustices make an already unpleasant and arduous task even more difficult. The inappropriate distribution and use of hardearned monies can leave a person quite angry and disconnected. It's bad enough the government wants something from me, now God does, too?

God is not concerned necessarily with our money, although its proper use does factor into our faith life. As the payment of secular taxes speaks of our allegiance to the government, our return to God speaks of our allegiance to God. All of creation, even the entire universe, is fashioned in the image and likeness of God. What speaks to God and has meaning and relevance to him? All of creation and indeed our very selves! God delights in us and when we present ourselves back to him, he delights even more! In giving back to God all that belongs to God, we set the axis of our lives correctly and put our priorities in proper order. All of our relationships, especially with God, our brothers and sisters, and all of creation are perceived more clearly as they really are. Using, accumulating, wasting, exploiting, hording, and self-preservation are no longer necessary.

THE PRECIOUS GIFT OF LIFE

Isaiah 5:1-7 Philippians 4:6-9 Matthew 21:33-43

ne question that Christians have been asking themselves over the past four years is: What does it mean to be pro-life? Our life is the first gift that God gives us. Everything else God wants to give us depends on it. What good would all the treasures of earth be if we didn't have our life to enjoy it? What good would even faith, hope, or love be if we weren't alive to receive them? Before God can give us anything else, he must first give us the gift of life.

That is why, as believers in Christ, we must always work to guarantee a right to life for all people from the time they are conceived until the time of their natural death. We never look at any human being — no matter how sick, no matter how deformed, no matter how needy — as a burden. Rather, we look at each person as a gift, a gift from God. And, if we take care of the most vulnerable among us — if we cherish their lives as a precious gift — it will surely change us for the better. We discover that caring for the lives of the needy will force us to clear away the things which don't really matter, like anxieties about our appearance or our status. It will help us to place the gift of life and the right to life at the center of our families and our society where it belongs.

In this Sunday's Gospel, the people who are put in charge of the vineyard forget that it doesn't belong to them. They want to keep the vineyard and its produce for themselves. They want to do with it whatever they want without respecting the demands of its true owner. They eventually go so far as to kill the owner's son. They took the gift they were given — the vineyard — and forgot to whom it belonged. Instead of honoring and protecting the gift, they squandered it, and it resulted in their ruin.

Can we see a parallel with today's society? How have we treated the gift of life entrusted to us? How have we taken care of the weak and needy in our society? Every year on this day —Respect Life Sunday — we ask these hard questions of ourselves and of our country. In an election year, these questions become even more pressing. Once we recognize life as a gift of God and every human life as made in God's own image and likeness, we can no longer fool ourselves that whether the unborn live or die is a personal choice. We can no longer kid ourselves that the lives of the innocent are ours to do with as we please. Nor can we look the other way when Black men are disproportionately incarcerated and murdered. Otherwise, as a society, we risk the calamity that befell the men in today's Gospel.

What does it mean to be pro-life then? It means to honor and defend every single human person without distinction. It means that human beings never lose their God-given dignity no matter what stage of development they are at, no matter how much or how little political power they have, no matter what they have done. It means that we consider all human persons as good in and of themselves, apart from what they can or cannot produce. On this Sunday let us renew our commitment to life, especially the lives of the most vulnerable members of our society.

Heavenly Father, Our life is your precious gift. None of us is random None of us is an accident None of us is unwanted For we were all formed by your creating hand. Gift us the grace to use our gift of life For your glory and the good of our neighbor May we never look down on anyone As unworthy of life, love, or respect Not the unborn, not the immigrant Not the poor, not the sick, not the disabled Not people of other races And not the prisoner. Help us always to see your image In those in whom it is the hardest to see So that we can fashion a society That is welcoming to every human life And in which every human life Has a chance to flourish. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Justice Matters - an interfaith network doing justice

AN INVITATION FROM PAT LECHTENBERG FOR ST. JOHN JUSTICE MATTERS TEAMS.

One of my favorites is an African proverb that says: Until the lion tells his side of the story, the tale of the hunt will always glorify the hunter. As we well know, there are lots of 'lion' stories left out of history – women, ethnic groups and in our case justice ministry organizations. Many will say it doesn't matter who gets credit as long as we've made things fair, equitable and just. The problem with this is the group challenging and making changes in unjust systems doesn't gain the credibility needed to gain support and growth of the group.

The groundbreaking for the Turning Point Crisis Center will be **noon**, **Friday**, **October 23**. This is a great opportunity for members of Justice Matters to remind the community, the civic leaders and decision makers that it was the challenge presented by our interfaith network that has resulted in providing crisis intervention training for all law enforcement personnel, that promoted the creation of an affordable trust fund, that helped defeat the expansion of our jail and then

earned the opportunity for tax papers to have a vote on creating a mental health crisis center and supporting services.



We need to continue to tell our history and give credit to our efforts that result in changes in our community to provide more opportunities for citizens who are without basic human needs to access shelter, food, medical care and other needed services. We are the ones who stand up and speak out for brothers and sisters who cannot speak for themselves. We are the feet, hands and voices of Jesus for all our neighbors who need help.

Please come to the groundbreaking for the Turning Point Crisis Center and by your presence give witness to the good Justice Matters has accomplished. Wear a Justice Matters tee shirt, or carry your JM yard sign (you should have received at your team's house meeting) or in some way identify yourself as a member or supporter of Justice Matters – our interfaith network working for justice. The location of the new campus which includes the crisis center is just north of the County Health Department and NE of the Lawrence Memorial Hospital. Masks and social distancing will still be necessary.




