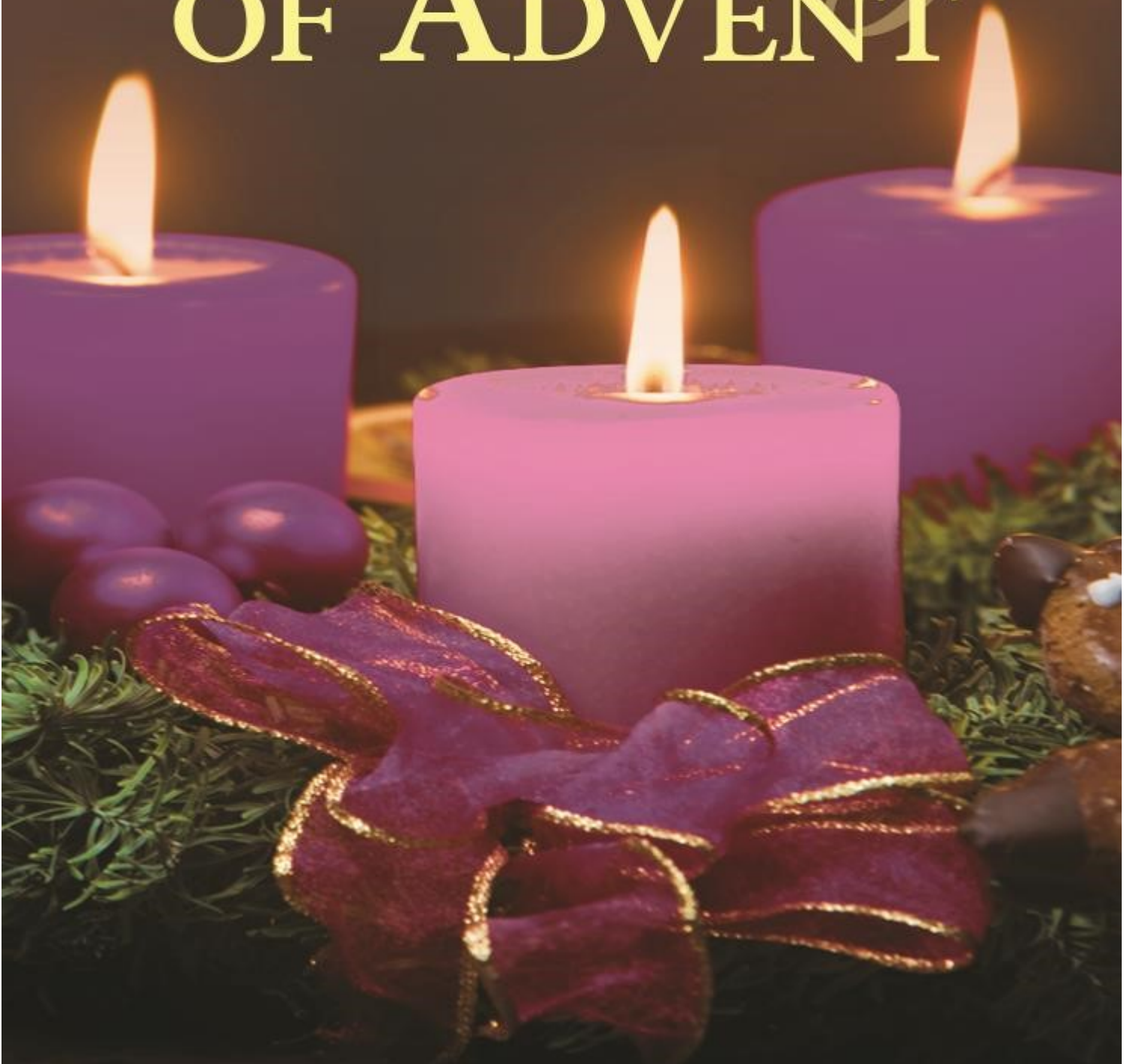

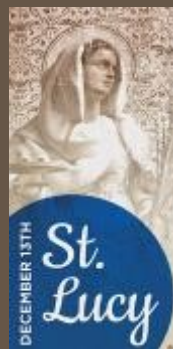

ST. LUCY | FEAST DAY DECEMBER 13



A name that means "light," St. Lucy (283 – 304) is the patron saint of those blind or suffering with eye trouble. Not much is known about her life, except that she was determined to remain a virgin and thus refused marriage. History tells the story of a frustrated suitor who eventually accused St. Lucy of being a Christian (at crime at the time), and she was executed in Syracuse, Sicily, in the year 304.

Today, we celebrate a number of traditions that incorporate symbolic meaning of St. Lucy as the "bearer" of light in the darkness of winter. This is particularly seen in Scandinavian countries, with their long dark winters. There, a young girl dressed in a white dress and a red sash (as the symbol of martyrdom) carries palms and wears a crown or wreath of candles on her head. In Denmark, Norway and Sweden, girls dressed as Lucy carry rolls and cookies in procession as songs are sung.

BOOKENDS BEFORE/AFTER SCHOOL CARE

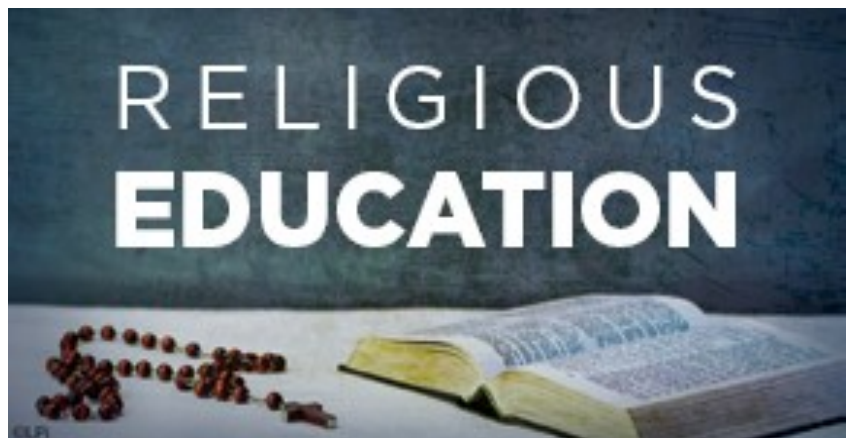

CONFIRMATION INFORMATION



Dear Parents,
We would like to thank you all for taking the time to communicate with us regarding the Confirmation formation process. We took your concerns to heart and prayed with them thoroughly before we made any decision. That being said, we have come to a decision on how formation for the Sacrament of Confirmation will be conducted this year. We will be providing the Doctrinal studies part of Sacrament in two formations: parish teens that attend a school

other than St John's will have sessions in the evening (day and time TBD); St John School teens will receive their studies during school hours. However, service opportunities will be outside of school hours. Each student will need to complete two different service opportunities in each of the two categories. There will be one focusing on a more physical labor aspect, and one focusing on a relational aspect. Service opportunities will be in large groups, uniting all St. John teens. In addition, we will be offering a retreat. We will inform you of the schedule as soon as possible. We will begin the formation process after the first of the year.

The winter shelter needs overnight volunteers for every night the the forecasted low is 35 degrees or lower between now and the end of February. If you are interested in helping, there is training, both from Family Promise of Lawrence (FPL) and

from the City of Lawrence. Here is the information:

FPL Partners with the City's Winter Emergency Shelter

FPL is partnering with The City of Lawrence to provide safe shelter for families through the winter months. The Winter Emergency Shelter (WES) is a program of the City of Lawrence to provide overnight shelter to people who need a warm place to sleep on nights forecasted to be below 35 degrees.

FPL is working with our congregational network to provide family sites for overnight shelter so that kids don't have to sleep on a gym floor in a group shelter setting.

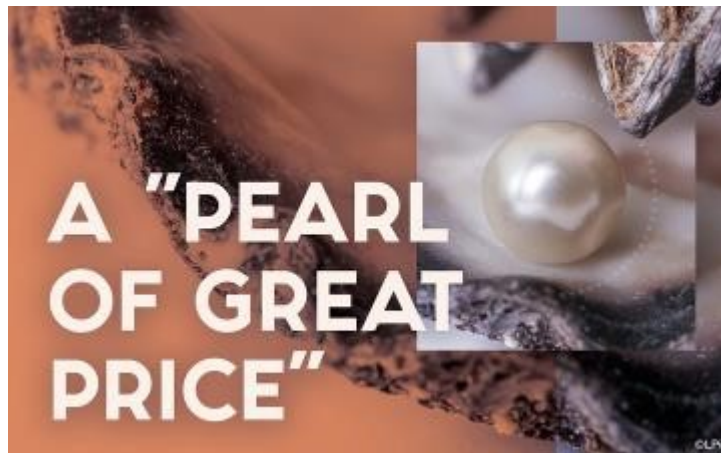
FOCUS ON THE WORD

GOSPEL MEDITATION 3rd Sunday of Advent

"From silly devotions and sour-faced saints, good Lord, deliver us!" St. Teresa of Avila

We've all heard the adage, "Laughter is the best medicine." In many ways, it really is. When was the last time you really laughed? The gift of imagination allows us to see possible things that are yet to be. Imagine a world filled with laughter. We take life too seriously sometimes. Fear, uncertainty, pressure, negativity, disappointment, and myriad other human experiences can rob us of the joy needed for laughter. God never promised us an easy road, and we do have to take the course of our lives seriously. However, there is a balance to be sought and a possible joy that can be brought even to the darkest and most challenging of encounters.

St. Therese of Lisieux reminds us that, "Joy is not found in the material objects surrounding us but in the inner recesses of the soul. One can possess joy in a prison cell as well as in a palace." Falling in love with God, who is present in all of creation, allows us to bring a depth of understanding to everything we do and experience. We can more easily see above and beyond things while pursuing the only One who can truly satisfy our hearts. When we realize that God, the king of Israel, is in our midst and with us, there is no further misfortune to fear. We can celebrate the wonder and beauty of God's gift of joy. It is no wonder that many saints radiate joy and have no reservations expressing laughter. They are happy because they have found a pearl of



great price.

We celebrate with joy today with hearts filled with expectation, wonder, awe, and beauty as we ready ourselves, even more excitedly, for the coming of our Savior. Do not fear and do not be discouraged. If you haven't laughed in a while, why? Something is preventing you from expressing the magnificence of your soul and the presence of God who dwells within. God's power and presence within us assures us that we are loved and kept in that presence. What more is really needed? Rejoice and laugh in the presence of God! It really is the best medicine and a most perfect way to convince others that God is really with us. "Go ahead, laugh! Live your life with joy and serve the Lord with laughter! The Well That Never Dries Up

Depending on how your mood is today, the words of Paul will hit you differently. "Rejoice always," he tells us. Well, if your football team is poised to win this weekend or next, maybe you're really feeling this vibe. But if you've got a long slog at work ahead of you this week and a to-do list that only seems to grow and never shrink, it may make you grumble. "Rejoice always? Always? When I'm tired? Cranky? When I'm sick of doing and giving? Thanks, Paul. I'll be sure to scribble that phrase on a Post-It and stick it to my dashboard for when some entitled punk inevitably cuts me off on tomorrow's morning commute."

When we feel this way, we know it's time to head back to the well. Think of all the places in Scripture where God compares

His love, His mercy, His salvation to water. And not just any water — living water, water that moves. God's strength is not a stagnant puddle sure to evaporate and disappear. It's water you can keep coming back to. It's water that never dries up.

Which is good news for us, because we never stop failing to do what we should, never stop failing to feel the joy and the compassion and the selflessness we are called to. We need a source of living water if we are going to 'rejoice always.' To be everyday stewards, we need a well that never empties.

The fountain of salvation never dries up. There is always more there for us to draw from. It's a sign of His commitment — so let us, in turn, be committed to Him.

CUENTO NÚMERO 13

Llanto, sangre y exilio (Mateo 2, 13-23)

Hace no demasiados años, cuando la guerra en Bosnia estaba en el clímax de la violencia, leí en un diario (no sé si habrá sido verdad o mentira) que los soldados serbios dejaban embarazadas a las mujeres musulmanas en los pueblos que sometían, para que tuvieran hijos serbios. También vi en noticieros (y éstos no eran "un cuentito") que una población de 12.000 habitantes, tomada por las tropas serbias, había sido reconquistada y sólo quedaban 600 sobrevivientes. No cabe en nuestra imaginación graficar este drama.

Pues bien, había una vez, en Sarajevo, una mujer musulmana que había sido violada por un soldado serbio. Contra la opinión del clan familiar, afirmó que no pensaba abortar, ni matar al niño cuando naciera, como otras lo hicieron con sus propias manos. Tuvo una niña. ... La familia las excluyó de sus afectos. La niña lloraba y la madre no tenía lágrimas en sus ojos ni leche en sus senos. La sangre era dueña y señora de la ciudad. Pasaban más tiempo en los sótanos, protegiéndose de los bombardeos, que en la pequeña pieza donde vivían. Mientras tanto, la niña crecía; enferma, pero crecía, entre el dolor y las lágrimas, entre el barro de las calles rotas por tanques que habían reemplazado a los tractores, y bayonetas en lugar de los arados.

¿La paz...? Nostalgia de un pasado demasiado lejano. Profecía vana de un futuro que jamás vería la luz, ciega como ciegos estaban los ojos de los muertos que ya no cantan ni bailan.

De pronto... nuevos rumores. Vendrían nuevas invasiones. Los tratados de paz no se respetarían. La sangre volaba por los aires, teniendo las nubes por carroza. - ¡No...! ¡No podríamos soportarlo otra vez! Si una vez morimos, no se puede morir dos veces. Y salieron al exilio.

¿Dónde queda el exilio? No lo sabemos. Puede ser que, en Alemania, o en Austria, o en Croacia... o en la tumba de nuestros hijos. Largas caravanas salieron y ocuparon todos los caminos, con mujeres y niños, viejos e inválidos, con los inocentes de todo tiempo, expulsados por los Herodes de todo tiempo.

De pronto, una mujer vieja llamada Raquel lloró amargamente, apretando en sus brazos a su pequeño hijo. No querían que la consolara, porque el niño ya no existía.

La noche cerró sus fauces sobre la silenciosa caravana, roto el silencio sólo por los gritos de las viudas y el llanto desconsolado de los huérfanos.

La nieve del camino, poco a poco, se fue tiñendo de sangre y lágrimas.

Si alguna vez tienes la tentación de creer que va no hay santos inocentes, leé el periódico y te enterarás de que Jesús Niño sigue caminando hacia el exilio, y que testigos de su Nombre continúan llorando la sangre de sus hijos, que a nadie dañaron.

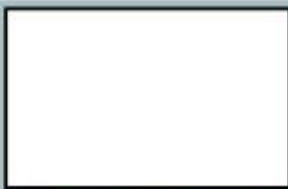

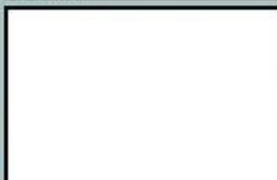
