

ST. PETER CANISIUS FEAST DAY DECEMBER 21


Born in Holland, St. Peter Canisius (May 8, 1521 – December 21, 1597) was a preacher, teacher, and writer throughout his whole life. At the age of 19, he received a master's degree from the university at Cologne. Soon afterwards, St. Peter met Peter Faber, the first disciple of Ignatius of Loyola, who influenced him so much that he eventually joined the Society of Jesus.

St. Peter Canisius founded colleges and seminaries, served as a missionary, cared for the sick or imprisoned, and wrote close to eight volumes of letters — many about St. Cyril of Alexandria and St. Leo the Great.

A man blessed with many talents, St. Peter Canisius is a wonderful example of a man who developed his talents to further God's work here on earth.


BOOKENDS BEFORE/AFTER SCHOOL CARE

FOCUS ON THE WORD

GOSPEL MEDITATION 4th Sunday of Advent

St. Augustine tells us that a "Christian is a mind through which Christ thinks, a heart through which Christ loves, a voice through which Christ speaks and a hand through which Christ helps." As we look around and out at the world, we do not have to search too far before we come face to face with inequity and injustice. There is so much unfairness, prejudice, anger, hatred, violence, and want. The stories of human heartache, people being hurt, deprived of life's necessities, loneliness, and sickness are far too commonplace. For many of the world's ills, the vices of greed, lust, pride, gluttony, and jealousy are clearly among the more significant root causes.

Why doesn't God just step in and fix this mess? After all, God created this world, and one would hope that he would step up and take some measure of responsibility for it! Once we sit with this thinking for a while, we can begin to realize just how flawed it really is. God did take responsibility and God did fix the problem! God sent us Jesus Christ as the divine solution to the world's ills. It is not God who has shirked responsibility, we have. We are the ones who continually fail to set our own personal needs, wants, and securities aside so that One more powerful than us can use us.

Mary had to set her needs aside in order for the Son of God to come into the world. Put simply, Mary listened and believed. Having opened herself to being an instrument of the Divine,



God could use her as his mind, heart, voice, and hand. She became God's vessel so that God's greatness could reach the ends of the earth and peace could come upon the world. God's fix for the world's difficulties is you and me. We are the ones who confess that Jesus Christ came into the world as the Son of God, the Prince of Peace, and herald of justice. All we have to do is believe, as did Mary, that what has been spoken to us by the Lord will be fulfilled. Then, we can step aside and be the Christians we claim to be. What a difference it would make if every person who professed to be Christian truly understood that their one and only vocation is to be God's instrument. What a beautiful, equitable, and just world it would be.

Baby Jesus' Wish List

Odds are you've got a Christmas list going by now — gift ideas for everyone from your nephew to your goddaughter to your mailman. But what about the birthday boy? What's the gift Jesus gets from you this Christmas?

If you've ever read the Book of Leviticus, you know all about the sacrifices God asks of the Israelites, referred to in the reading from Hebrews today. Leviticus can be a chore to read — a little repetitive, a little intimidating. There's a lot of very specific actions that God asks His Chosen People to complete to make up for whatever they have done wrong. In essence, it's a bit of a wish list for gifts.

But it's a wish list that can really confuse you. What's God going to do with a cereal offering? The kidneys of an animal? If you

look closely, what God is doing here is beautiful. He's customized his wish list to only those things He knows the Israelites can give. It's God saying, in what amounts to theological baby-talk for folks who barely know of Him and His ways, exactly how they could be stewards. "Do this, but don't do that. If you do that, do this and you will find My mercy."

Our guide to stewardship — the Gospels of Christ — is less precise because by the time of Christ, God's people have grown in understanding of love and mercy and relationship with the divine. Through Christ, we find out that God's real wish list didn't really consist of cereal offerings and the kidneys of various animals. It's far simpler, but luckily, it's something we still have on-hand. All He wants is our whole heart.

CUENTO NÚMERO 14

Una pequeña travesura de Jesús (no muy gorda) (Lucas 2, 41-52)

En todo tiempo y lugar, los chicos, hacen travesuras, a veces grandes, a veces de menor cuantía. Y parece ser que el Jesús de doce años no se salvó de esta ley común.

José y María lo habían llevado a Jerusalén para celebrar la Pascua en la Ciudad santa. ¡Toda una aventura! Es como si a un niño de algún pueblo escondido se lo llevan a Buenos Aires por unos días. Le faltarían ojos para devorar lo que se le va presentando a la vista. Por supuesto que Jerusalén no era Buenos Aires, pero si "la Capital".

Oraron y festejaron. Recorrieron las calles llenas de gente de todo lugar. Hicieron algunas compras. Es posible que el pequeño Jesús se haya conquistado algún amigo, como sucede a los chicos cuando están en viaje de turismo... o en peregrinación.

Era costumbre, en la época de José y María, que, al regresar a sus hogares, lo hicieran en caravanas: una de hombres la ora de mujeres. Los niños iban, indistintamente, en una u otra. Jesús "'tendría" que haber estado en una de ellas, pero no estaba. Una pequeña travesura lo tentó: ¡se quedaría en la Capital! ¡Y se quedó! ¿Para qué?

Un chico de nuestros días estaría copado con los juegos electrónicos, o viendo cómo alquilar algún video de interés, simplemente con otros muchachos y chicas, o caminando por la peatonal o.... Pero el casi adolescente Jesús estaba en el Templo, con los curas de aquel tiempo, discutiendo de religión, de la última encíclica, de los obispos o las religiosas o los catequistas y sus problemas; de cuestiones de vida eterna o muerte eterna, de la salvación, del Pueblo de Dios y su vocación, de la santidad, de la solidaridad entre los hombres, de la libertad de la conciencia, del pecado y la gracia, en fin... de todos esos temas que trata el Catecismo.

¡Qué raro en un chico de su edad! hora, si alguien hiciera eso, la mamá lo llevaría al psicólogo, no vaya a ser que esté medio enfermo, pues estos temas, tarde o temprano, hacen mal "a la cabeza", y de política y religión mejor no discutir.

José y María, como cualquier papá y mamá de nuestros días, si están regresando a casa de un viaje y descubren que su chico no está en el ómnibus, pondrían el grito en el cielo: ¿Dónde se habrá metido este mocoso? (dicho con fuerza y con alguna mala palabra mezclada en la frase). Pues bien: el "'mocoso" fue encontrado al tercer día. Es posible que hayan ido al hospital y hayan dado aviso al comando radioeléctrico. Si la angustia era demasiada grande, a lo mejor, temblorosos, hayan preguntado en la morgue. Finalmente, fueron a la Catedral (al Templo, quiero decir...), y allí estaba, tan campante, hablando con los señores de la Conferencia Episcopal, con los párrocos, con los profesores del Seminario, iba y venía, con preguntas y respuestas. El evangelio nos habla de la angustia de José y María v de la fresca respuesta del mocoso Jesús: - ¿Por qué me buscaban? ¿No sabían que yo debo ocuparme de las cosas de mi Padre?




