


CONFIRMATION INFORMATION

Dear Parents,



We would like to thank you all for taking the time to communicate with us regarding the Confirmation formation process. We took your concerns to heart and prayed with them thoroughly before we made any decision. That being said, we have come to a decision on how formation for the Sacrament of Confirmation will be conducted this year. We will be providing the Doctrinal studies part of Sacrament in two formations: parish teens that attend a school

other than St John's will have sessions in the evening (day and time TBD); St John School teens will receive their studies during school hours. However, service opportunities will be outside of school hours. Each student will need to complete two different service opportunities in each of the two categories. There will be one focusing on a more physical labor aspect, and one focusing on a relational aspect. Service opportunities will be in large groups, uniting all St. John teens. In addition, we will be offering a retreat. We will inform you of the schedule as soon as possible. We will begin the formation process after the first of the year.



MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY

Update on Mental Health Ministry *By Susan Tabor and Nicole Allensworth*

You may remember seeing information about a Traveling Life Together ministry that was being started here several months ago, an attempt to respond to the stress of the pandemic. We then offered a Sanctuary mental health course late last summer and from it, our Sanctuary ministry was born and will replace Traveling Life Together.

In keeping with the tradition of love and caring and community in this parish, you'll be hearing more from us; we'll have things in the bulletin from time, often written by parishioners. We plan to soon offer self-care groups for people to be together in a supportive environment and work together to meet life's challenges in a Christian context.

There are a number of parishioners ready to minister, and we are led by a leadership team composed of Vincent Francisco, Ph.D., Brad Phipps, M.D., and Susan Tabor, social worker and trained spiritual director. We hope you will share with us any ideas you may have for community-building and building on our

wishes to promote good self-care and to fine-tune our skills in caring for others.

We would like to introduce you to the patron saint of those who struggle with mental challenges in life. See Nicole Allensworth's brief article below, and stay tuned for more updates from us!

Saint Dymphna



St. Dymphna is the patron saint for those struggling with mental llnesses. Dymphna was born in the 7th

century in Ireland. Her father was a petty king and her mother was a devout Christian. At the age of 14 years old Dymphna took a vow of chastity and sanctified herself to Christ. Shortly after her mother passed away her fathers mental health deteriorated, due to his deep, unanticipated grief at the loss of his wife, whom he loved deeply. Dymphna's father began to desire her

due to her resemblance to her mother. Learning of her fathers intentions, Dymphna fled the court with her confessor, two trusted servants and the king's fool. They ended up landing in what is the present day Belgium and took refuge in the town of Gheel. At this time Dymphna built a hospice for the poor and sick. Soon her father learned of her location and tried to get her to go back to his castle and marry him. Dymphna refused. Her father then drew his sword and cut off her head. Dymphna died at the age of 15 years old. St. Dymphna was canonized in 1247. The prayer to St. Dymphna is as follows:

Good St. Dymphna, great wonder-worker in every affliction of mind and body, I humbly implore your powerful intercession with Jesus through Mary, the Health of the Sick, in my present need. (Mention it) St. Dymphna, martyr of purity, patroness of those who suffer with nervous and mental afflictions, beloved child of Jesus and Mary, prayto Them for me and obtain my request.

Amen.

FPL is working with our congregational network to provide family sites for overnight shelter so that kids don't have to sleep on a gym floor in a group shelter setting.

CUENTO NÚMERO 12

Simeón: un viejo sabio con luzen el corazón (Lucas 2, 25-35)

Hace mucho tiempo, casi dos mil años, dos jóvenes fueron al Templo de Jerusalén para decirle al Señor su Dios, que lo primero y lo mejor sería siempre para él. Aunque la ofrenda de un par de pichones de paloma era muy poca cosa, era el todo de los pobres. José y María estaban dispuestos a cumplir con la Ley del Señor.

Sabemos bien -otros cuentos e historias y leyendas nos lo narran- que los files esperaban que se cumplieran las promesas de Dios. ¿Y cuáles eran esas promesas? Que Dios no iba a dejar solo a su pueblo. Que la libertad vencería a la opresión. Que el amor se mostraría más poderoso que la muerte. Que los pobres serían enriquecidos y las lágrimas desaparecerían de los ojos dolidos. Que un reino de justicia se instauraría en medio de los hombres, como bandera levantada entre las naciones. Todo esto estaba latente, vivo como en carne viva y abierta, entre los que no habían renegado de la esperanza. ¡Y no es fácil esperar cuando todo me grita dejar de hacerlo!

En el Templo, apenas ingresaron José y María, un viejo sabio con luz en el corazón, se les acerco. Sus ojos estaban cansados, casi ciegos, pero el alma resplandecía como la nieve herida por el sol del mediodía. La justicia había sido la ley de la vida de Simeón: así se llamaba este anciano. La piedad acentuaba su identidad de hijo de Dios. Esperaba que la luz barriera con las tinieblas y que el Príncipe de la paz reinara con si suave dominio de amor. Reconoció en María a la hija de Sión, a la Mujer que, según la Biblia, derrotaría al Mal, a esa doncellahuerto florido de Israel. Reconoció en José a un varón justo. Oyó los latidos del niño y, en ellos, descubrió los latidos del corazón enamorado de Dios.

Dios le había hecho una promesa: que sus ojos no se cerrarían ni sus oídos se apagarían hasta ver al Ungido del Señor. El Espíritu de Dios lo empujó esa mañana, como brisa suave

que invita a caminar, a ir al Templo donde habita la gloria de Dios. ¡Y el hoy de la historia del Señor apareció ante sus ojos! Ya no necesitaba creer; ahora, veía. Ya no necesitaba esperar;

ahora, el bien esperado, ese bien que con los años de caminar parecía estar cada día más lejos, se presentaba ante él, quieto, como diciéndole: -Ya no necesitas caminar más.

Entonces, el anciano Simeón, viejo en canas y joven en malicia, viejo en años, pero niño en inocencia, tomó al Niño en sus brazos y, como quien hace una ofrenda a lo alto, como

quien devuelve al cielo lo que al cielo pertenece, canto: -Ahora, Señor Dios, mi Dios bueno, puedes dejar que tu viejo servidor descanse en paz. ¡Llévame a ti, porque mis ojos han visto lo que todos quieren ver! Llévame a tu lado, no porque me haya cansado de esperar, sino porque ya no hay nada más que esperar. He visto la salvación que tú has preparado y estoy sentado a tu mesa para disfrutar del banquete de bodas. Esta salvación tuya, será luz para iluminar a todo hombre, y será,


