






Treat yourself to a donut or cookie after all Masses Saturday, May 1, or Sunday, May 2.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM - ADULT TRAINING (VIRTUS)

In light of the current health conditions, one prudent and preventative measure we are taking is to make the VIRTUS Protecting God's Children for Adults training available Online as an option. Effective immediately, due to COVID-19, the Archdiocesan requirement for attending a VIRTUS Protecting God's Children for Adults workshop live session will be suspended and the option

of the online version of the module can be offered in lieu of live training. This is a temporary safety precaution, and parishes may still offer the live training session available as an option if they prefer as long as the local county and state ordinances in effect at the time of the event are followed. Please note, the training must still be completed prior to participants working around youth, but the requirement may now temporarily be met by completing the online Protecting God's Children module. Individuals needing to attend a session will be offered the option of the online module at the time of registration. They will still need to follow the background screening and



policy completion process at the time of registration. Individuals who are already currently registered for an upcoming live session, may log back into their account and change to the online module. These procedures will be reviewed and updated periodically as needed and are in place to protect you, those you work with, and your family. 



FOCUS ON THE WORD

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE 5th Sunday of Easter

"Spiraling out of control," is a phrase that can easily describe the current display of human existence. In addition to the violence, unrest, uneasiness and turmoil that are common elements of our daily news, other essential pieces are misplaced or missing. Many lack an objective center around which to order and structure their lives or a clear set of definable goals or mores to act as guideposts and life directives. It appears that "feelings" have become a "new god" and traditional structures and ideals set aside. It is almost as if history only shows that we got this whole thing wrong and many are determined to finally set things right. The real truth, however, is that while wrongs and errors are certainly a part of our often-checkered past, it is hardly the case that all was wrong. It is not our task to rewrite the history of our lives, but to learn from mistakes that were made, and preserve the perennial wisdom at the root of our successes. Learning is an essential part of being human.

The question becomes, however, from whom do we learn? Some have such a hard time placing God in that position, but that is precisely where God needs to be. God is the Master Teacher from whom all of humanity learns and gets its cues. It is in and through this relationship with the Gardener of Life that we are fashioned and pruned into the people we are intended to be and can be. It is only in God that we are able to find our best selves. Sadly, many think that religion too, as well as history in general, has also gotten all this wrong. Yet, our resurrection faith tells us differently. We are reminded, today especially, that



we are meant to remain in Christ as Christ remains in us. We are also reminded that Jesus, the Incarnate God, is the vine upon which we grow, the branches that flow from the source of God's life.

Giving up our will to God's can be a painful endeavor. It is not easy to set our own desires and wants aside and allow God to step in and direct and guide our growth. But this is the only way to prevent deadly weeds from overtaking us and bringing us to a place of self-destruction. God's commandments are the very guideposts and benchmarks we need, yet many seek to remove them from all public view because they appear to limit selfexpression and suppress what is considered by many to be "human freedom." They are the only way we can find freedom, however. And, until we learn this fundamental lesson, we will continue to spiral out of control, never really knowing who we are, what our potential can be or how life really can be lived. We will not know peace.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP -Recognize god in your ordinary moments

Branching Out Isn't Always What It's Cracked Up to Be "That's a really beautiful tree branch. Man, would you look at the bark on that thing? The others are real duds, but that lowhanging branch has really got it all together."

I've never heard anyone say this. Maybe I just need to hang out with more arborists, but I can't recall ever hearing someone admire the particular beauty of a single branch. When someone comments on a tree, it's usually the whole tree — perhaps a visual element of it, like the color of the leaves or its height. But people don't usually zero in on one branch.

Maybe that's because usually, if one branch is looking a little weak, chances are every other branch is, too.

The Bible tells us that when we bear fruit as good everyday stewards, it is for the Father's glory. We are the branch on His magnificent tree. What we have is from Him, and what we do likewise points back to Him. We also tend to reflect how well the other branches around us are incorporating the nutrients



coming their way. That's all fine and good in theory. In practice, it can be an arduous exercise in humility.

When I do something virtuous or charitable or kind, there is a part of me that wants to stand out for it. I think that's true for all of us. We've given of ourselves in some way or overcome some human temptation to accomplish a little bit of good in this world, and even though we know God sees us, we'd really love for everyone else to see it, too.

It's a struggle, for sure. But we need to remember that our fruit belongs to the whole tree. — Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS ©LPi

SOCIAL JUSTICE SOCIAL ACTION

This column was prepared on April 21, the day before Earth Day. A belated Blessed Earth Day! I found some material on immigration and environment that I want to share. It is sobering.

What is a Climate Migrant?

• Primarily, people who must leave their homes due to sudden onset weather events, such as flooding, forest fires after droughts, intensified storms, etc.

• There is also some climate migration caused by slow onset events, such as sea level rise, air pollution, and rain pattern shifts. This type of migration is currently rare but will increase dramatically over time.

• In 2017 there were 68 million climate migrants (an all time high), mostly within their own nation.

• Including some domestic climate migrants, mostly due to Western wildfires.

• Estimated 200 million climate migrants by 2050, mostly from Latin America, South Asia, and Sub-Saharan Africa.

• Consistent pattern: those who had the least to do in causing this severe weather/climate events, bear the gravest impact. "The scope and scale of human migration due to climate change will test the limits of national and global governance as well as international cooperation."

John Podesta, Center for Human Progress

Climate Events as a Migration PUSH Factor

- Destruction of homes
- Lack of clean water
- Food scarcity
- Agricultural degradation
- Disease outbreaks
- Infrastructure breakdown
- Political unrest
- Violent conflict

• The Syrian civil war in the 2010's, and rise of ISIS, has been directly attributed to a major drought which caused destitute farmers to relocate to already overcrowded cities.

Climate Change and the US Border Crisis

A Case Study in "Sudden Onset "Events

• In November 2020, Hurricanes Eta and Izola made landfall in Central America, within two weeks of one another.

• 600,000 people displaced.

• In Honduras, up to 80% of agriculture was decimated.

• With few options at home, an estimated 9,000 people, often leaving families behind, joined the northern caravan to the US.

• These sudden onset events exacerbate an already desperate situation for many, and become "the final straw" which prompt a decision to emigrate.

Kiribati – A Case Study in "Slow Onset" Events

• The Pacific Island nation of Kiribati, population 100,000, is submerging due to sea level rise. It is not expected to survive the century.

• Current residents are:

• Moving to higher ground (internal migration, delaying the inevitable)

• Trying to build defenses (which the tiny nation cannot afford)

• Trying to emigrate to other nations, which limited success (New Zealand is currently accepting 75 per year.)

• Ignoring the problem for now. (A common worldwide response.)

• The issue of climate migration due to slow onset events such as (but not limited to) flooding will no doubt increase in coming years, as highly populated coastal areas throughout the world become threatened.

So, what is ours to do? ADVOCACY

• Give refugee status to climate migrants.

• Currently, only those who are facing political persecution are permitted entrance as refugees.

• UN is beginning to move in this direction; however, this is not binding on its member nations.

- Provide assistance to nations affected by sudden onset events.
- Help ease their desperation, thus providing alternatives to migration.

• Take reasonable short/long team actions to mitigate the impact of slow onset events.

• This is absolutely essential for reasons which go beyond immigration.

As Pope Francis has said in Laudato Si', "Everything is connected."


