



SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM - ADULT TRAINING (VIRTUS)

In light of the current health conditions, one prudent and preventative measure we are taking is to make the VIRTUS Protecting

God's Children for Adults training available Online as an option. Effective immediately, due to COVID-19, the Archdiocesan requirement for attending a VIRTUS Protecting God's Children for Adults workshop live session will be suspended and the option of the online version of the module can be offered in lieu of live training. This is a temporary safety precaution, and parishes may still offer the live training session available as an option if they prefer as long as the local county and state ordinances in effect at the time of the event are followed. Please note, the training must still be completed prior to participants working around youth, but the requirement may now temporarily be met by completing the online Protecting God's Children module. Individuals needing to attend a session will be offered the option of the online module



at the time of registration. They will still need to follow the background screening and policy completion process at the time of registration. Individuals who are already currently registered for an upcoming live session, may log back into their account and change to the online module. These procedures will be reviewed and updated periodically as needed and are in place to protect you, those you work with, and your family. 
FOCUS ON THE WORD

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Pentecost Sunday

Begin by taking a moment to calm yourself, focus on your breathing and become aware of the life force that flows through your veins. Center yourself in the words and affections of St. Augustine's Prayer to the Holy Spirit, "Breath in me, O Holy Spirit, that my thoughts may all be holy. Act in me, O Holy Spirit, that my work, too, may be holy. Draw my heart, O Holy Spirit, that I love but what is holy. Strengthen me, O Holy Spirit, to defend all that is holy. Guard me, then, O Holy Spirit, that I may always be holy." Sanctifying, bringing things to wholeness, blessing, restoring and creating are just some of the fruits of the presence of the Holy Spirit. Being filled with the Holy Spirit is not always about proclaiming loud cries of praise or singing alleluia from a roof top. It is about unfolding and encountering the ordinary in an extraordinary way. Being filled with the Holy Spirit means being filled with the fullness of God's life and in touch with the power and wonder of God's presence. It's about becoming holy.

It is not just for saints or people who have a religious vocation. Holiness is for the ordinary, simple run- of-the-mill person who desires to love God, others, and all of creation. When an ordinary, humble person becomes connected with life and the wondrous power of God's love, they begin to live life more deeply, a bit more reverently, desire a simple fare and find themselves relishing in ordinary beauty. Their senses become attuned to the Author of life and they realize that they are not alone. The Holy Spirit connects all of the dots of human experience and existence, bringing everyone to center on the Divine Presence. The Holy Spirit does not just breathe "on me" but "in me" and is the force behind every breath I take. Take a moment to soak that thought in. There is the Divine Presence of the Holy Spirit in me, right now. When a person becomes in touch with truth, they know that when inspired by the Holy Spirit, his or her actions are



not solely their own. They realize that they are moved by Divine Grace and drawn to things not found in secular affairs.

We live in a world where it is hard to discover truth. Real truth is veiled by so many imposters that it is hard to find, especially for those who are young. It is easy to get fooled and duped and often, without full conscious awareness of doing so, we choose to walk down a path of self-absorption and destruction. It is only the Holy Spirit, through the ministry of the church most especially, who guides us to truth and shows us the way to be the graced and holy human beings God made us to be. The wonders and inspirations of today's Feast of Pentecost are necessary to share with both those we love and those who only casually cross our paths. The first disciples, touched by the Holy Spirit, brought the Gospel to the ends of the earth one step at a time. Is it unrealistic to ask that we assist in that same mission by helping people understand who they are and who God is one at a time? Ask the Holy Spirit to alleviate the fear in your heart that prevents you from doing so.

May is Mental Health Awareness Month. The National Catholic Partnership on Disability offers 10 things we should know about mental illness.

10 Facts Parish Leaders Should Know About Mental Illness

- 1. Mental Illness is a disease of the brain and is not a moral issue.
- 2. One in four families are directly affected by mental illness. If you don't encounter persons or families dealing with mental illness in your parish then, they are either hiding (often in plain sight)or feel unwelcome. What you see is often the tip of the iceberg.
- 3. Stigma isolates people, and sometimes kills both body and soul.
- 4. The symptoms of mental illness vary in intensity and over time and so should support. Each situation is unique.

- 5. The public mental health system is at or above capacity, this is why it's important to help people find help.
- 6. Many persons with serious and persistent mental illness do not know they are sick and think their behavior and beliefs are normal.
- 7. Persons with mental illness are more likely to be harmed than to do harm.
- 8. Mental illness is often linked with alcoholism and substance abuse.
- 9. Poverty and underemployment are pervasive among persons with mental illness. Many of the problems of persons with serious mental illness have more to do with their poverty than their disease.
- 10. Understand the importance of making and keeping good boundaries.



Small Group FAQ

1. What is a small group?

Small groups are made up of 8-10 people who meet on a regular basis for the purpose of connecting relationally with one another, growing spiritually through prayer, bible study fellowship, and serving together. In short, small groups encourage all members to worship, connect, grow, and serve as missionary disciples.

2. Are small groups biblical?

The book of Acts is very clear about how God intends for His people to grow and have their needs met in the church. "They devoted themselves to the apostles teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread, and to prayer. All the believers were together and had everything in common. Every day they continued to meet together... they broke bread in their homes and ate together... and the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved." Acts 2:42, 44, 46-47

3. When, where, and what do small groups meet about?

Groups meet at various times, either monthly or every other week, and in many different locations throughout Lawrence. Your group will decide where the best time, frequency, location, and content to meet.

4. What kinds of small groups are available?

There will be many different groups to choose from including: Men Women Singles Couples Mixed Others by request

These groups offer natural connecting points through which members come together and form real Christian relationships. Within these affinity categories, there are specific groups that are based upon age and stage of life.

5. How can I find a small group?


