Again, we are partnering with Catholic Charities and Centro Hispano to help families in our Lawrence community who are living in poverty. Again this year, we hope to provide households with a food voucher so that they can buy food to go with the turkey they will

be receiving for Thanksgiving from Catholic Charities.

This is where you come in. If my math is correct, if 400 families in our parish would donate \$10, we could provide forty families with a \$40 food voucher.

FOCUS ON THE WORD

GOSPEL MEDITATION

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

On December 10, 1979, a very petite holy woman known as Mother Teresa of Calcutta spoke these words in her Nobel Peace Prize Acceptance Speech, "But I am sure in the families and many of our homes, maybe we are not hungry for a piece of bread, but maybe there is somebody there in the family who is unwanted, unloved, uncared, forgotten, there isn't love. Love begins at home. And love to be true has to hurt. I never forget a little child who taught me a very beautiful lesson. They heard in Calcutta, the children, that Mother Teresa had no sugar for her children, and this little one, Hindu boy four years old, he went home and he told his parents: I will not eat sugar for three days, I will give my sugar to Mother Teresa. How much a little child can give. After three days they brought into our house, and there was this little one who could scarcely pronounce my name, he loved with great love, he loved until it hurt. And this is what I bring before you, to love one another until it hurts, but don't forget that there are many children, many children, many men and women who haven't got what you have. And remember to love them until it hurts."

Living authentically and walking with holiness always involves sacrifice. It has to hurt. Only actions springing from true and

deep sacrifice demonstrate true integrity. Without sacrifice, even what is apparently a generous gesture can be nothing. It is no wonder that the widow who contributed from her poverty received great admiration from Jesus and the young child in our story above the interest of Mother Teresa. It is easy to make the houses of our lives look like they are in perfect order when in fact they are in shambles within. Religion can sometimes make this hypocritical masquerade easy to accomplish. We can find ourselves in all the right holy places, reciting all of the correct prayers, participating in community collections, and reciting the proper doctrines only to find ourselves empty, shallow, self-focused, and overly anxious about personal concerns.

The one who learns to discover their inner poverty, their spiritual poverty, is the only one who can truly place him or herself at the mercy of God. It is only when we allow ourselves to be empty that we realize Who we actually need to fill us. This is the real meaning of trust. Many of us are afraid to take the plunge. We allow ourselves to detach from only so much, always keeping a watchful eye on the protection of our securities. We understand the value of poverty, but we do not want to become too poor. As long as we are able to recognize this tension, our reluctance to let go and our struggle, we can continue our journey of humbly learning how to love so deeply that it hurts. God understands and waits.

ST. FRANCES XAVIER CABRINI FEAST DAY NOVEMBER 13




You may recognize the name St. Frances Xavier Cabrini (1850 – 1917) as the first United States citizen to become a saint. Known for her deep trust in God, she was a courageous woman doing the work of Christ.

Her life of service began when she was first refused admission to the religious order which had educated her to be a teacher. Not one to take things face

value, she instead focused her charitable work at the House of Providence Orphanage in Cadogno, Italy, and in 1877, professed vows there and took the religious habit.
When the bishop closed the orphanage in 1880, he named St.

Frances Xavier Cabrini prioress of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. However, she had a dream she was determined to fulfill. Since her early childhood, she had dreamed of being a missionary in China. Pope Leo XIII, however, urged her to see the need in the west. She traveled with six of her fellow religious sisters to New York City, where they worked with the thousands of Italian immigrants residing there. Although she experienced many disappointments during this time, she persevered. When she arrived in New York, the house intended to be her first orphanage in the United States was not available. Rather than come back to Italy and the order she oversaw, she instead found a way to establish that orphanage elsewhere — plus a few more. Throughout her life, she is known for founding 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the abandoned, the uneducated, and the sick. She died

Job: una llaga y un grito (Job 30)

¿Oyeron ustedes hablar alguna vez de Job? Según nos cuenta un antiguo relato, era un buen hombre. Tenía familia, muchos bienes, era feliz. Su mujer lo apreciaba y tenía fieles amigos. Sus hijos correteaban, queriendo ganarle en velocidad al viento, y cometían las mismas travesuras que otros chicos de su edad. Cuentan también que, un día, Míster Diablo, bicho astuto y ambicioso, pervertido y mentiroso, chanta, loco, maligno, padre de todo vicio y pecado, no conforme con los muchos adeptos que iban a su capillita, y con las numerosas fechorías con que contaba en su haber, se metió con don Job, aunque con el permiso de Dios, debidamente firmado y autenticado ante escribano público nacional: lo sabía fiel y permitió que lo pusieran a prueba. Y los problemas cayeron sobre él, uno a uno, como el huracán Mitch sobe Centro América o como un tifón que se desata en alta mar, convirtiendo cada ola en un gigante de mil cabezas; o como un terremoto que desploma torres elevadas; como un soplido que desmorona un castillo de naipes. O como el insulto del mundo en los oídos de un pobre hombre que a nadie hizo mal. Desde ese entonces, las revistas especializadas se refieren a él como "el paciente Job".

Quebraron sus empresas. La plaga diezmó a sus rebaños. Se apestaron sus cultivos. Fue calumniado y enjuiciado. Su esposa y sus hijos se rebelaron conta el tildándolo de "fracasado". Los amigos desaparecieron como arte de magia, tal como sobreabundaban en tiempos de bonanza. Las enfermedades lo asolaban: menos el SIDA (enfermedad aun no inventada), tuvo de todo. En la calle, las pandillas de chiquilines crueles y maleducados le gritaban: - Las siete plagas del Egipto! (En esos tiempos, los chicos tenían "cultura bíblica", y sabían hacer sesudas bromas pesadas).

Nos dice el relato mencionado al comienzo que el pobre Job se cascaba con una teja: tal era la picazón que sus llagas le provocaban. Todo él era un lamento vivo. El mayor dolor fue la soledad (hoy diríamos "la marginación").

¿Dónde está Dios, ese Dios al que siempre guardo fidelidad? ¿Dónde su familia, sus amigos y sus bienes? ¿Dónde su salud? ¡Qué ganas locas de maldecir tanta desgracia! ¡Cuantos deseos de levantar al cielo un puño cerrado clamando venganza, como lo haría el mas aguerrido de los manifestantes callejeros, para gritarle a Dios su odio profundo por haberlo abandonado a su mala suerte!

Su esposa, Zoraida, dulce en otro tiempo, pero ahora avinagrada, lo invitaba e incitaba: -¡Dále, fracasado...!¡A ver si sigues con ganas de rezar el Rosario e ir a misa!¡Invita al párroco a cenar, como lo hacías antes, para hablar del Movimiento Familiar Cristiano, de la catequesis y de lo bueno que es Dios! ¿De qué te sirvió comprar los casetes del padre Mamerto Manapace e ir a los cursos de Liturgia del padre Héctor Muñoz? ¿De qué te sirvió bendecir a los chicos con agua bendita antes de irse a dormir, y tener la foto del Papa en el comedor?


