





# **SOCIAL JUSTICE SOCIAL ACTION**

On Monday, October 4, we will celebrate the Feast Day of Saint Francis of Assisi. He is, of course, the founder of the Franciscan Order of Friars and Religious, and also of the Secular Franciscan Order. And on October 3, Franciscans celebrate the Transitus, the Eave of the death of St. Francis with a vigil service accounting the events during the time just prior to his death, with readings from the writings of his brothers and readings from the Scriptures and the Psalms, and with prayers.

Did you know that Secular Franciscans are the only official lay Order in the Church?

Francis had a great love for the Gospels and part of his lifelong work after his conversion was to live as the Gospels taught and as Jesus lived.

There are so many things about St. Francis that bear mentioning. Peacemaking and preserving peace were important to him. Francis too lived in a time in which there were many wars. He was a soldier as a young man and after he had begun his Order, he discerned a call from God to visit the Muslim Sultan to try to bring peace. So, he and a few of his brothers went to visit the Sultan. Francis and the Sultan engaged in serious conversation about their faith and what was important to them. What developed between them was a tremendous respect for one another. Because of this, the Sultan asked his armies to grant Francis and his fellow travelers safe travel back home. Even earthly creatures, the birds and animals, sensed Francis' joy and his gentle nature. Another story has it that Francis entered a village where there was word of a dangerous wolf at the entrance of the town. The townspeople were afraid of the wolf and its ferocity. As Francis came upon the wolf, he began to gently speak to it as he approached it, as he inquired of the wolf why it was afraid. When he reached the wolf, he reached out to pet the wolf, stroking its fur gently. The wolf stopped growling and became gentle as a lamb.

Francis told the people the wolf had been as afraid of the people as they were of him. Both were responding from that fearful place within that breeds hatred. After that, the people cared for the wolf and the wolf cared for them, becoming a protector of their town. The wolf was known as the Wolf of Gubio.

And we've all seen pictures and statuary of Francis and the birds and other animals surrounding him, wanting to be close to him. He would often call them "brother" and "sister", and the earth was sister Mother Earth.

How can we, like Francis, transcend our fear and pain, and grab onto that joy and peace he experienced? Part of that joy is hope and believing hope exists. And that hope brings us joy, despite our sadness, fear and pain.

Francis taught us so many lessons for which we can be grateful. Thank you, God, and thank you, Saint Francis!
