



VIRTUS. PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN FOR ADULTS

All employees of the Archdiocese (including clergy and consecrated laymen and laywomen) and all volunteers (including Vacation Bible School volunteers), over the age of 18, who have substantial contact with children and/or youth, in the school or church, are required to submit a background check and attend VIRTUS, the awareness session of the Archdiocese's child abuse program, Protecting God's Children for Adults, prior to working with children or youth.

All VIRTUS sessions are online, however, this will be changing soon. You will need to register an account with our Archdiocese and complete the background check and paperwork.

- Click on "Begin the registration process." 2.
- 3. On the "Select" organization drop-down menu, select "Kansas City in Kansas (Archdiocese)".

- You must complete the background check and paperwork at this point. 5.

Plan to have 20-30 minutes to register and complete the online paperwork. The system will not allow you to save what you 6. start working on and return at a later time to complete. DO NOT USE THE BACK BUTTON ON THE ADDRESS BAR, OR IT WILL DELETE YOUR PROGRESS AND YOU WILL HAVE TO START OVER.

VIRTUS Registration MUST BE DONE ON A COMPUTER, not a tablet, iPad or phone. The system will not allow these devices 7. due to security reasons.

SOCIAL JUSTICE SOCIAL ACTION

We hope you got some ideas from the last several columns we published concerning living a more eco-friendly life. Environmental issues are so incredibly important, as they involve

our very ability to sustain life on the earth with which the Lord has gifted us.

It's such an important issue that the Pope has devoted the next seven years toward making climate care and environmental justice a strong priority, and is asking that all parishes create or revive a climate care team.

According to Jose Aguto of Catholic Climate Covenant, there are 1.8 billion Catholics worldwide, which is 16% of the world's population.

In 381 AD the Nicene Creed proclaimed us as "One Holy Catholic Apostolic Church"

- * We are unified every day by the same Mass worldwide.
- * We have a singular unity which includes being Church in unity with Pope Francis
- * There are 70 million Catholics in the United States.

* There are 193 dioceses and archdioceses, each with a Bishop.

- * There are 17,000 parishes.
- * There are 6000 parochial schools in this country.
- * There are 220 Colleges and Universities.
- * Catholic Charities (one of the largest social service agencies in the world) serves the US.

* Catholic Relief Services (one of the largest emergency and relief services in the world) serves worldwide.

Numbers such as these represent power, folks; a powerful force that could reverse the pattern of destruction that has become a part of our existence over time. Think of what would happen if all of these people, in all of these parishes with the support of all of the dioceses, schools and universities, and national and worldwide Catholic service organizations all instituted or revived climate care teams! Doesn't that prospect, that climate care image, make you want to be a part of such an initiative! Stay tuned for more details in this column over the next few weeks!

In Laudauto Si, Pope Francis' encyclical on climate care and environmental justice, Pope Francis pointed out to us that actively championing on behalf of climate care and environmental justice represents a requirement of our faith. Living a vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not an optional aspect or a secondary aspect of our Catholic Christian experience. Living out this vocation is truly a way to live out our commitment as Christians to social justice.

ST. POLYCARP OF SMYRNA | FEBRUARY 23

As a disciple of St. John, the Evangelist, St. Polycarp was able to hear about Jesus' life, death, and resurrection directly from those who witnessed it. Because Polycarp was ordained as Bishop of Smyrna by St. John, he is one of three chief Apostolic Fathers, along with Clement of Rome and Ignatius of Antioch. During his life Polycarp defended the Church against heresies. His important writing, the Letter to the Philippians, quoted the Gospels and Acts of the Apostles, stressing Paul's authority in the Church and setting out clear arguments against the gnostic heresy that denied Christ's divinity. The early period of the Church was a dangerous time to be a Christian and like many, St. Polycarp was martyred. He was captured by Romans and sentenced to burn at the stake. However, the fire did not touch him, instead rising up like sails around him. Seeing that the flames would not injure Polycarp, the Romans stabbed him instead. The Martyrdom of Polycarp is perhaps the earliest fully preserved account of a Christian martyre.

Unos muchachotes inmaduros y cabezones (Marcos 10, 25-40)

Parece ser que el "amiguismo" no es un invento argentino de nuestros tiempos, y que ya en otras épocas, en Palestina, dos hermanos, Santiago y Juan, hijos de don Zebedeo, se acercaron a Jesús para que los acomodara en el más allá, cuando el Reino de Dios tuviera vigencia plena. Otra de las narraciones evangélicas dice que fue la mamá de estos chicos, la que pidió por ellos. Tanto la mamá como Santi y Juancito, querían ser como los edecanes del presidente de la nación: -Jesús maestro bueno: cuando estés en tu gloria (debe ser un lugar fenomenal...), sentado en la Gran Nube y gozando de una tranquilidad que ni en un crucero por el Caribe se consigue, haz lo posible para que nos sentemos uno a tu derecha y el otro a tu izquierda, así quedamos bien ante los muchachos del barrio, que se morirán de envidia.

Y la mamá recordó a Jesús que los chicos habían sido buenos con él, haciéndole más de un mandado sin pedir ni la más mínima propina, y que se acordara también de cómo ella le había cocinado -para que llevara a Galilea en una de sus correrías apostólicas- unas empanaditas de dulce de membrillo como para chuparse los dedos y... jojo...!, no se las había cobrado, sino que eran de regalo, a pesar de las necesidades que ella tenía en su casa y de que don Zebedeo hacía un par de meses que no recibía la jubilación a tiempo.

¿Qué problema tendría en darles a sus muchachos lo que le pedían? ¿Qué le costaba este favorcito? - ¡Dele, Maestro..., dele!, le insistían los chicos bastante inmaduros y pesados como plomo.

Jesús, sacando fuerzas de flaqueza para no perder el buen humor, les contestó-palabras más, palabras menos.... -¡Ustedes están locos de remate! ¡No saben lo que piden! Pero ¿que se creen, que soy un funcionario de algún ministerio y que me dejo llevar por el amiguismo? Ya bastantes " ñoquis" hay en el Templo, entre los recaudadores de impuestos de Imperio romano y en cuanta oficina publica instalada, como para que yo me dedique a acomodar a los amigos. ¡No...! ¡Mil veces no! ¡Ya basta de embromar, muchachos empecinados!

Y ahora mismo cantamos y proclamamos que eres más que la vieja y que el equipo de nuestros amores. Juramos y rejuramos que seremos capaces de beber el trago amargo de tu dolor.
