

ARCHBISHOP'S CALL TO SHARE 2022

Have you ever done a "trust fall"? It's a pretty crazy concept. With your eyes closed and arms folded over your chest, you fall straight backwards. Of course, there's a very important element that hasn't yet been mentioned: someone is standing behind you, ready to catch you. The "trust fall" illustrates such an important truth: we are only willing to take a risk, to "fall," when someone we trust is with us. In our Gospel today, Peter commits to his own "trust fall," casting in his nets after a whole night of fruitless fishing, all because he trusts the Lord and the Lord instructs him to. As a parish, we're doing a "trust fall" right now, as we strive to respond to our Archbishop's Call to Share appeal. It can feel like a big risk to ask to be vulnerable and ask our community members to help meet our diocesan needs, but we do it because we trust—both in the Lord, but also in all the people who make up this parish community—including you. Maybe contributing to the Archbishop's Call to Share appeal feels like a risk for you. Which is fine! The key, however, is to never forget that we're not doing this alone. We're taking part in the Archbishop's Call to Share appeal as part of an archdiocesan community we trust, and with the love and support of a Lord who never leaves us. When we change our perspective from "fear" to "trust," how does our willingness to give change? Take some time today to ground yourself in trust of the Lord, and see how your heart responds.

VIRTUS. PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN FOR ADULTS

All employees of the Archdiocese (including clergy and consecrated laymen and laywomen) and all volunteers (including Vacation Bible School volunteers), over the age of 18, who have substantial contact with children and/or youth, in the school or church, are required to submit a background check and attend VIRTUS, the awareness session of the Archdiocese's child abuse program, Protecting God's Children for Adults, prior to working with children or youth.

All VIRTUS sessions are online, **however, this will be changing soon**. You will need to register an account with our Archdiocese and complete the background check and paperwork.

Go to: https://www.virtusonline.org.

- Click on "First-Time Registrant"
- 2. Click on "Begin the registration process."
- 3. On the "Select" organization drop-down menu, select "Kansas City in Kansas (Archdiocese)".
- 4. Create a User ID and Password, complete the profile information, and select a class to attend.
- 5. You must complete the background check and paperwork at this point.
- 6. Plan to have 20-30 minutes to register and complete the online paperwork. The system will not allow you to save what you start working on and return at a later time to complete. DO NOT USE THE BACK BUTTON ON THE ADDRESS BAR, OR IT WILL DELETE YOUR PROGRESS AND YOU WILL HAVE TO START OVER.
- 7. VIRTUS Registration MUST BE DONE ON A COMPUTER, not a tablet, iPad or phone. The system will not allow these devices due to security reasons.

Here are more eco-friendly tips for you:

86. Save money with solar energy Switching to solar energy may be expensive at first but over time you

get to save so much money compared to using electricity and gas. Solar energy once installed is actually almost free and environmentally friendly.

87. Shut doors and close curtains

It may seem pretty obvious and mundane to do this but yes it helps to conserve energy around the home. Shut doors and curtains in areas you're not using even during the day. Also, always cool or heat just the rooms where you spend the most time.

88. Set the water heater to the lowest comfortable setting

You don't need to set your water heater at a high degree, especially if you're just a few people in your home. The recommended setting is around 115 degrees Fahrenheit.

89. Turn off all appliances and electronics, not in use

Turning off appliances and electronics not in use is another everyday habit that will save you a lot of energy. You can also use power strips that efficiently distribute energy to your appliances when in use wasting less energy.

90. Wash clothes in cold water

You don't need to wash clothes in hot water. This is just a waste of energy. Use the cold setting on your washing machine and you'll save around \$115 every year. You can put that money into better use.

91. Air-dry dishes and clothes

Yes, a dryer means less work but it also means more energy and higher electricity bills. Let your dishes air-dry instead of using your dishwasher's drying feature. Hang your clothes outside to dry.

92. Clean or replace air filters

Air conditioners and heaters use a lot more energy if the air filters are dirty. Keep a regular cleaning and replacement schedule to ensure the filters are always clean and working properly.

93. Install motion-activated light switches

You don't need lights to stay on all the time, especially in areas that are rarely used. Increase energy efficiency by installing motion-activated light switches in such areas. Kids may often forget to switch off lights when they leave a room so motion-activated lights will be a perfect solution.

94. Consume less

We accumulate so much waste through our consumer habits. Many of us are guilty of buying stuff just because they look good at the moment. To truly live an eco-friendly lifestyle, practice buying just want you NEED. The less you consume, the less there will be to waste.

95. Eliminate single-use

A lot of the plastic we use around the home and office is for single use. A lot of plastic utensils, paper napkins, and plastic water bottles end up in the trash. Where you can, replace everything you use once with reusable items.

FOCUS ON THE WORD

GOSPEL MEDITATION

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man," these words, uttered by Simon Peter, can be found on any one of our lips. What real significance do I have in the big picture of God's Divine plan? Even though we try our best to hide it, we all suffer from a lack of faith. We get tired, confused, and often lack any sincere desire to put anything into our relationship with God. It's easier to simply reap whatever benefits the world has to offer and call it a day. Floating along on the superficial currents of life doesn't require much effort and seems to get us through the day. Confronting our own infidelity, apathy, weakness of spirit, and doubt in God's providence, how can we even remotely be considered a worthy vessel of God's presence or credible voice for His message?

This is the irony of faith. God doesn't seek the perfect vessels. He likes the broken ones. There is something to be said about living honestly and sincerely, and wrestling with sin, imperfection, and weakness rather than skipping through the peripheries of life with pretention, arrogance, and mendacity. If we believe ourselves to be our own "god" and serve only ourselves, we close the door to ever being used by the real and only True God. But, if we at least acknowledge that there is One greater than ourselves, then even in our deepest poverty and lowliness, God can enter.



Lessons are best learned from those who suffer. Only someone who has been lonely and lost can attest to the beauty of both Divine and human friendship. Only those who have really lost their way know what happens when they are found. Only those who are afraid know what it is to be calmed by God. The Gospel is messy because life is messy. There are no black and white solutions to problems and challenges that are hazy and gray. When our hesitancy to encounter God gets replaced by friendship with God, we become more aware of our dignity and the fact that we are loved just as we are. We cannot be afraid to share our struggles, reservations, fears, and sinfulness with others. Our genuineness and sincerity will speak of the God who blesses us in our weakness.

EVERYDAY REFLECTION

The gift of the Mission

Early on in my work in parish ministry, I had to deal with a tough human resources situation, letting some staff members go and stepping into a role that demanded more of my time and energy.

In moments like this, stewardship can feel burdensome. Things take a turn we didn't expect, perhaps in spite of our best efforts. Maybe more is asked of us than we want or feel prepared to give.

But that's when we need to remember that

stewardship isn't a job that we apply for. It's a gift bestowed directly from God, the Creator of all, and that can be scary all on its own, if we are preoccupied with our own unworthiness. What we might want to do is fall on our knees like Simon Peter and announce, "Depart from me, Lord — I am sinful."

But what if we stop looking in the mirror and look instead to God?

All those years ago, when I was faced with that ministerial challenge, I asked my wife to join me. What started as a tough situation turned into a decade of shared ministry with her — an experience I wouldn't trade for anything. It was a burden that became a gift.

We must remember that God knows what He is about. In His mercy, He gives us what we need as everyday stewards. When God calls out, "Whom shall we send?" we — in all our sinfulness — are allowed to cry out "Send me, Lord!" And He sends us out and behold — our nets tear with the bounty we harvest in His name.

Un paralitico con su camilla a cuestas (Marcos 2, 1-12)

Tampoco ablandó todos los corazones endurecidos. ¿Es así o no? Y

sí Jesús no lo hizo antes, no podemos pretender que lo haga ahora, dejando vacíos todos los hospitales del mundo.

Pero el pequeño Néstor volvió a la carga: -Hermanita... Yo tengo fe y acepto lo que me dice, pero... ¡extraño tanto jugar al fútbol con los chicos del colegio! Además, mi mamá me tiene que ayudar con todo, y lamento ser para ella una carga tan grande. ¿Hasta cuándo estaré así? ¿Toda mi vida...?

La hermana María de los Ángeles tenía los ojos llenos de lágrimas, ante la bondad de un niño preocupado por la tristeza de su madre, casi más que por su propio dolor (aunque no poder jugar al fútbol le diera pena...).

A Néstor se le iluminaron los ojos. Sabía lo que iba a suceder, pero, antes, se dio el lujo de una travesura.
