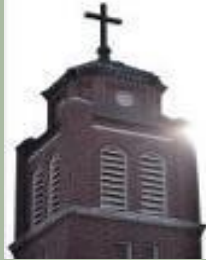

ARCHBISHOP'S CALL TO SHARE 2022

The Gospel is the Good News. It shows us the path to everlasting life. But sometimes it does this not just by showing us what to do, but also demonstrating what not to do. Today is a great example. Jesus preaches in Nazareth, where he grew up. The hometown crowd is expecting to hear some inspiring words, and maybe even see some miracles. But that's not what Jesus has in store for them. Instead, he challenges them, pointing to their self-centeredness and their unwillingness to open-up to God. Definitely not the easy message they wanted to hear! This is a moment of decision for his audience. Do they allow Jesus's hard words to change them, leading to conversion and deeper relationship with God? Or do they put up walls, and respond with anger and stubbornness? We know how they chose. The challenge for us is to choose differently when we're confronted by a challenging message from Christ and His Church. One of those challenging topics in our parish today is the need to support the *Archbishop's Call to Share* appeal. It can be easy to react to this conversation by putting up walls or tuning things out. But the parish's needs are real. What's more important than whether we give or not is whether we allow ourselves to be challenged by the invitation to contribute, allowing ourselves to lower our defenses and to prayerfully listen and discern. Try it out today, and see how the Lord prompts you.

PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL REPORT

NOTES ON 2021 FINANCIALS

This has been a challenging year, to say the least, with nearly everything we did impacted by the pandemic. With that being said, a big thanks goes to Cris Denning and Jo Ann Williams for their work this past year for making it possible for us to have these numbers to report on.

For the 12 months ending June 30, 2021, our total income was about \$2,576,000 compared to total expenses of \$2,762,000, or a loss of about \$186,000. As a result of the Payroll Protection Plan we were able to cover this loss.

The total income of \$2,576,000, compared to the prior year of \$2,863,000, is down about \$287,000.

The largest area of the income is Collections and Offerings at 53% of the total. This was down from the prior year by about \$94,000. The next largest area on the graph is School Tuition/Fees/Food Service and Fund Raisers, making up 18% of the total income. This area was lower than the prior year by about \$258,000. The lower numbers were directly impacted by the pandemic.

The school operating expenses were about 56% of the budget, with church operating expenses accounting for 42%. It is our goal to get to a more balanced income/expense ratio. Before COVID we were making good progress on this year to year, but the last two years the progress has slowed due to income shortfalls and more personal protective equipment for school children and staff.

SOME GOING FORWARD FINANCE COUNCIL ITEMS

We are entering the budget season now, and over the next few months we will be assembling, discussing and approving budget numbers for the 2022-23 fiscal year.

Through the hard work of the Buildings and Grounds Committee we are able to make better plans for maintaining our facilities. One of the projects we expect to hear more about will relate to our old and antiquated heating and cooling system.

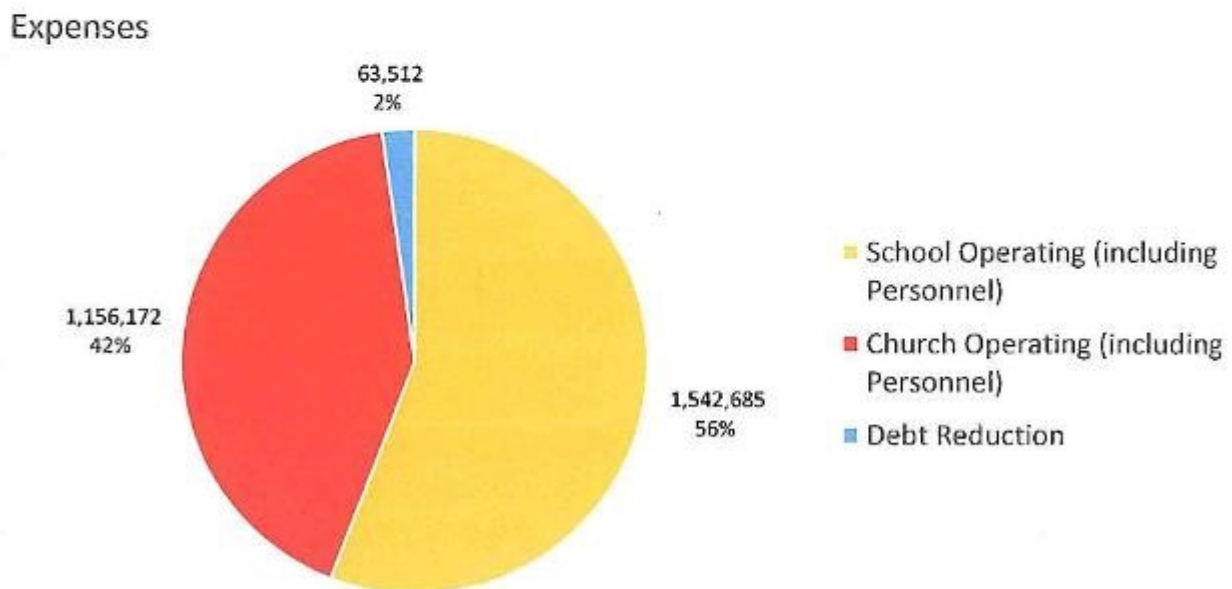
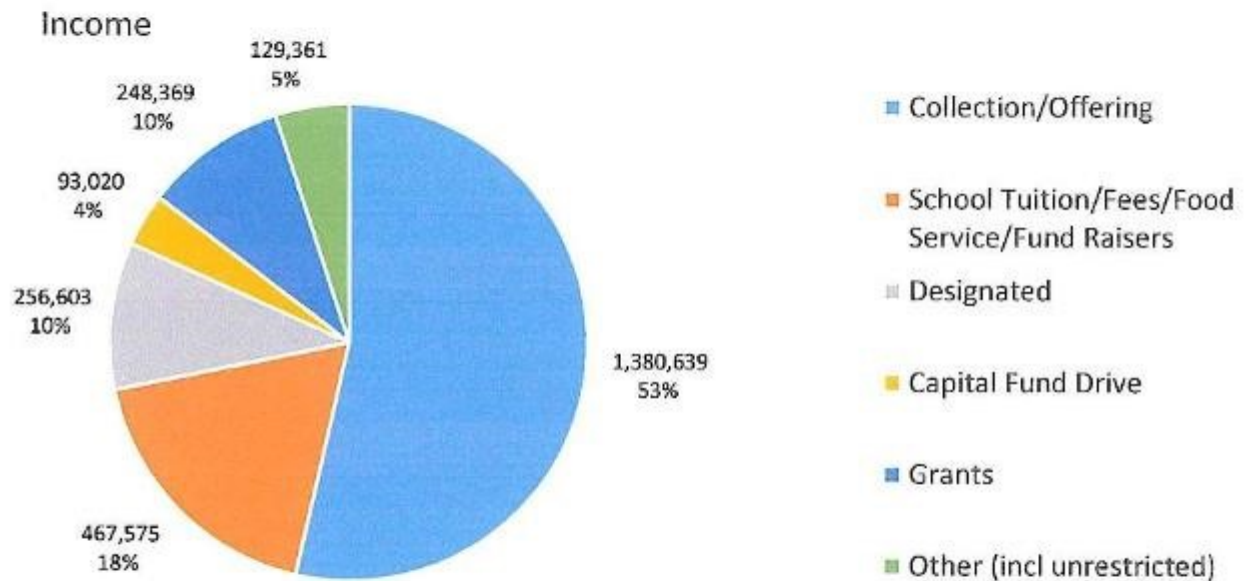
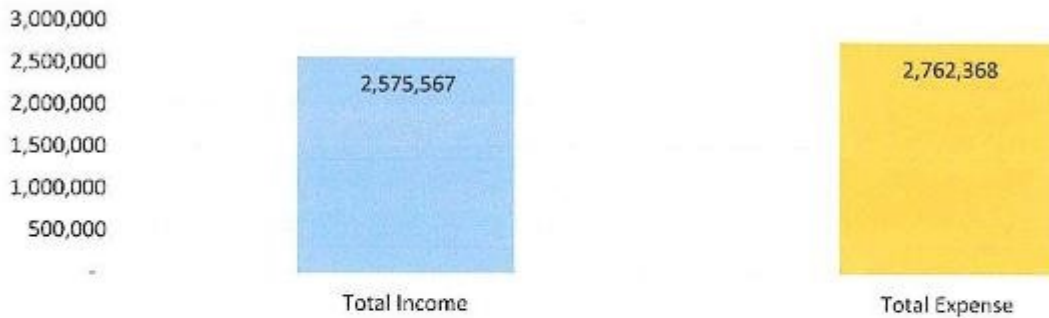
Another area we will be working on is a plan to pay off the loan for the gym project.

VIRTUS, PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN FOR ADULTS

All employees of the Archdiocese (including clergy and consecrated laymen and laywomen) and all volunteers (including Vacation Bible School volunteers), over the age of 18, who have substantial contact with children and/or youth, in the school or church, are required to submit a background check and attend VIRTUS, the awareness session of the Archdiocese's child abuse program, Protecting God's Children for Adults, prior to working with children or youth.

All VIRTUS sessions are online. You will need to register an account with our Archdiocese and complete the background check and paperwork.

Go to: <https://www.virtusonline.org>.

1. Click on "First-Time Registrant"
2. Click on "Begin the registration process."
3. On the "Select" organization drop-down menu, select "Kansas City in Kansas (Archdiocese)".
4. Create a User ID and Password, complete the profile information, and select a class to attend.
5. You must complete the background check and paperwork at this point.
6. Plan to have 20-30 minutes to register and complete the online paperwork. The system will not allow you to save what you start working on and return at a later time to complete. DO NOT USE THE BACK BUTTON ON THE ADDRESS BAR, OR IT WILL DELETE YOUR PROGRESS AND YOU WILL HAVE TO START OVER.
7. VIRTUS Registration MUST BE DONE ON A COMPUTER, not a tablet, iPad or phone. The system will not allow these devices due to security reasons.

76. Cut your showers short

The more time you spend in the shower the more water you use. Take shorter showers to save more water. Also, don't let the water run as you soap up. Turn on the tap when rinsing yourself.

77. Don't run the dishwasher or washing machine until it's full

Who doesn't love a sparkly kitchen! Putting your dirty dishes in the washer as you use them will give you a clean sink but it's a waste of water. Instead, run your dishwasher or only when it's full.

78. Keep an eye on your bill to spot leaks

Did your water bill not make any sense this month? No, it's not you using more water, you probably have a leak somewhere. Check your pipes for any leaks and have them repaired immediately.

79. Water outdoor plants in the early morning

Watering your plants in the morning requires less water as the temperatures are cooler. Evaporation is less in the morning compared to evenings so less water is wasted.

80. Install a rain barrel

We lose so much rainwater that we could otherwise use. Harvest roof water from gutters and downspouts and use it around the home.

Eco-Friendly Energy Tips

81. Turn your refrigerator down

Your fridge consumes about 13.7% of all your home energy. Reduce the amount of energy your fridge uses by setting it at 37 degrees Fahrenheit. Your freezer should be set to 3 degrees Fahrenheit in order to consume less energy.

82. Use energy-efficient light bulbs

Energy-saving CFL or LED bulbs are the best when it comes to consuming energy used to light your home. Install these bulbs and reduce your lighting energy by around 25-35 percent.

83. Install a timer for your water heater

Install a timer for your water heater and set it to automatically turn off your heater whenever you leave home for an extended period as well as at night when you don't need hot water. This way, you get to save energy and your electricity bill.

84. Add an insulating blanket to older water heaters

Old model water heaters lose a lot of energy through standby heat. Cover your heater with an insulating blanket to reduce the amount of energy needed for standby heat loss. You can reduce energy by 25%–45% and save about 4%–9% in water heating costs.

85. Turn off incandescent lights when you are not in the room

Make it a habit to switch off lights as soon as you leave a room. Incandescent bulbs are especially high consumers of energy so keep them on for as long as necessary and turn them off when not in use.

Una vez, más, veremos en este cuento, que Jesús nos pide cosas imposibles para nosotros..., aunque posibles para él.

¿Recuerdan la conmovedora obra Romeo y Julieta? ¿Vieron la extraordinaria película que Zeffirelli filmó sobre ese hermoso drama de Shakespeare? ¿No les pareció un claro ejemplo de que el amor triunfa sobre el odio? Además, sin caer en modelos tan románticos y clásicos, ¿no has perdonado alguna vez? Y perdonar ¿no es una forma de amar? Y si perdono, ¿no es porque alguien, aunque sea "en chiquito", ha sido mi enemigo, me ha hecho mal y pide mi perdón?

Bueno... ¡ahí va el cuentito!

Cuando yo era un chico de ocho años, un compañero me gritó: - ¡Gordo bachicha, come salchicha! ¡Al gordo chanco se lo come el carancho! ¡Chanchitongo, cara de mondongo! ¡Gordo jamón, cara de lechón! 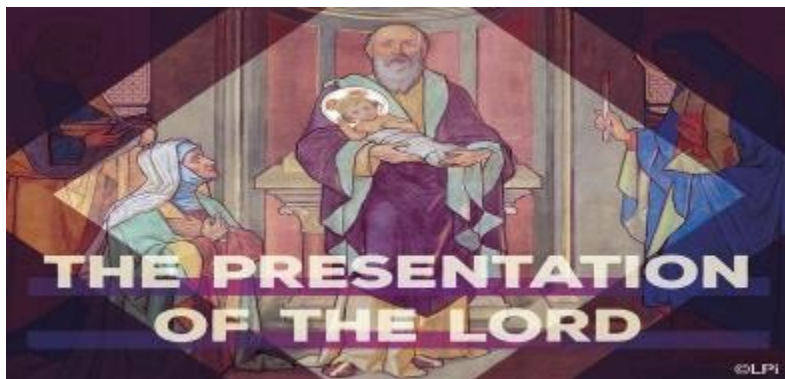
