LENTEN OBLIGATIONS

All Catholics 14 years of age and older are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, March 2, and all the Fridays of Lent. Catholics 18 to 59 years of age are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday — a fast consisting of one normal meal and two lesser meals, with no eating in between. It is also recommended that Catholics find opportunities throughout the Lenten season to complement their fasts with prayer, reception of the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist, and positive works of charity.

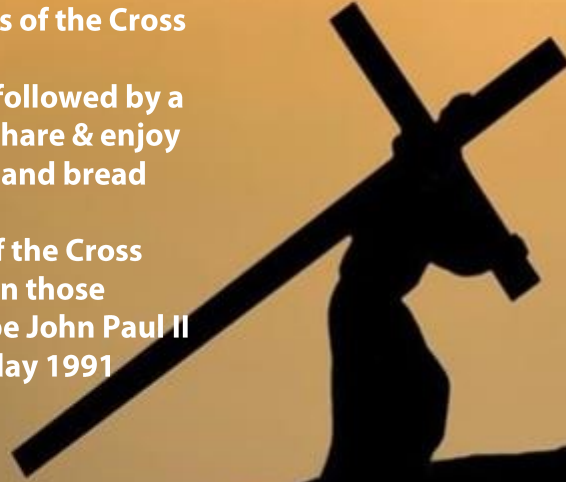

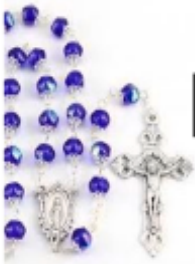

VALUE THEM BOTH AMENDMENT MEETING

Come learn about the Value Them Both Amendment on **April 2, at 8:30am in the church basement**, presented will be made by Father Bernie Gorges. Kansans can help protect women and babies in our state by learning about the Value Them Both Amendment, which we will vote on in the August 2 primary election.

The amendment:

- Protects existing Kansas law that keeps babies from being aborted up to the moment of birth
- Prevents taxpayer-funded abortion and extreme procedures such as partial-birth and live-dismemberment abortions
- Preserves safeguards that require the abortion industry to protect women with important clinic safety standards

VIRTUS, PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN FOR ADULTS

All employees of the Archdiocese (including clergy and consecrated laymen and laywomen) and all volunteers (including Vacation Bible School volunteers), over the age of 18, who have substantial contact with children and/or youth, in the school or church, are required to submit a background check and attend VIRTUS, the awareness session of the Archdiocese's child abuse program, Protecting God's Children for Adults, prior to working with children or youth.

All VIRTUS sessions are online, **however, this will be changing soon.** You will need to register an account with our Archdiocese and complete the background check and paperwork.

Go to: <https://www.virtusonline.org>.

1. Click on "First-Time Registrant"
2. Click on "Begin the registration process."
3. On the "Select" organization drop-down menu, select "Kansas City in Kansas (Archdiocese)".
4. Create a User ID and Password, complete the profile information, and select a class to attend.
5. You must complete the background check and paperwork at this point.
6. Plan to have 20-30 minutes to register and complete the online paperwork. The system will not allow you to save what you start working on and return at a later time to complete. DO NOT USE THE BACK BUTTON ON THE ADDRESS BAR, OR IT WILL DELETE YOUR PROGRESS AND YOU WILL HAVE TO START OVER.
7. VIRTUS Registration MUST BE DONE ON A COMPUTER, not a tablet, iPad or phone. The system will not allow these devices due to security reasons.

SOCIAL JUSTICE SOCIAL ACTION

Some of us are spending time during Lent attending to the ways in which we do—or don't—dialogue well with people. One thing we have noticed is that when we interact in ways that are hurtful, not only does the person with whom we spoke feel badly, but we often feel badly as well.

Cardinal Sean O'Malley, OFM.Cap., from the Archdiocese of Boston, has quoted Pope Paul VI in saying that dehumanizing discourse, including racism, not only wounds its target but that the speaker is also "mutilated by their selfishness." For our Lenten reflection, we might entertain and pray over the following questions:

In what way might my selfishness—the perceived self-interest that causes me to distance myself from others with whom I am at odds—mutilate me? Has my image of anyone been "mutilated" after I heard that person use dehumanizing or demonizing language about another? How might I respond more peaceably if/when this happens again? What do I need from God to help me make permanent behavioral changes that would reflect my change of heart?



As a reminder, plan to attend one of the synod listening sessions after Masses this weekend or respond online; more information about where to find and complete the online survey is in the bulletin, the e-blast, on the website and on our parish social media. ST. RUPERT OF SALZBURG | MARCH 28



St. Rupert of Salzburg is also known as the "Apostle of Bavaria and Austria." Although mostly legend, it is believed that he was born sometime around 660 in Gaul, which is now part of France. It is possible that he is a descendant of the Merovingian royal line. Not much is known about the saint's early life.

We do know that Rupert was first appointed as Bishop of Worms in present-day Germany and despite many good works there, the pagan population eventually beat him and forced him from the city. Rupert retired to Rome for a time until Duke Theodo of Bavaria asked him to come to help establish the Church more firmly in Bavaria. Rupert agreed and brought with him a group of priests. Rupert traveled the region, effecting conversions, miracles, healing.

Eventually Rupert chose to settle at Juvavum an old Roman city mostly in ruins. He renamed the city Salzburg or "Salt Castle," and established there a great cathedral and monastery under the Rule of St. Benedict. His niece became abbess of the Benedictine convent he founded nearby. Rupert was the first bishop of Salzburg, serving also as abbot of the monastery.

St. Rupert is usually portrayed carrying a vessel of salt, as he helped establish the salt mining industry for which he named the city. It is said that Rupert died on Easter Sunday though sources disagree on the year, which could have been around 710 or possibly as late as 718. ©LPI

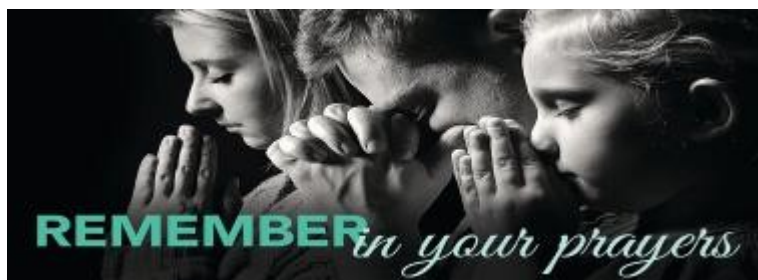

CUENTO NÚMERO 28

¿Quién Una oveja traviesa se perdió (Mateo 18, 12-14)

Aunque el título sea el que está arriba, el personaje más importante en este cuento, no es la oveja, sino el pastor.

Había una vez una ovejita que, como toda oveja, tenía que dormir en el corral. El pastor las sacaba a pastar, y allí estaba gozando del paisaje bucólico, como en esas películas de Escocia o Irlanda, con gramilla verde y pequeñas colinas. Pero como este cuentito se desarrolla en Palestina, no había paisajes verdes ni arroyitos, ni frescor. Para encontrar una sombra había que ser un mago.

Ovejas traviesas hay en todo el mundo, ¡hasta en Suiza, donde los chicos son tan limpios y disciplinados! En el Israel de tiempos de Jesús, una oveja del rebaño de un pastor, quiso conocer mundo y se dijo: -¡Qué aburrido estar en el corral! ¡Qué plomo hacer todos los días lo mismo y a la misma hora! (esto lo dijo en arameo...). Y fabricó en su cabezota de oveja (que no creo que sean los ejemplares más inteligentes de la fauna animal) un plan: ~Esta noche, cuando mis compañeras duerman, saldré en puntas de pie y, sin que nadie se dé cuenta, iré a dar unas vueltas por el vasto y ancho mundo. Hace tiempo que leo el suplemento "Turismo" del diario La Nación, y hay algunos lugares muy lindos que querría conocer. ¡Y se fue, no más! La puerta tenía una cerradura nueva, recién colocada, así que no sabemos cómo habrá hecho para salir. A lo mejor, tomó envión y dio un salto. Puede ser.

A la mañana siguiente, el pastor llegó al corral, silbando contento. Él dormía en una carpita cercana. Entró en redil, pegó unos gritos después de saludar, puso en fila a las señoras ovejas, y ordenó: -¡Numerarse! Y comenzaron: ¡Uno, dos... cuatro... diez! Pero faltaba una. Las hizo numerarse de nuevo y esa "una" seguía ausente sin aviso. Tomó lista nominal, y era Amalita. -¡Ya me imaginaba!, dijo el pastor. Esta Amalita fue siempre un poco alocada. ¿Por dónde la buscaré?

Y el pastor, que era buen pastor, pensó: - ¿Dónde se habrá metido esta chica? Apenas la encuentre sabrá lo que es bueno. La voy a hacer ayunar, y por tres días se quedará sin postre, ¡y con lo que a ella le gusta el flan con crema! Imaginó que no andaría por otros campos, porque a Amalita siempre le atrajo la noche y el ruido, pero no había estado nunca en el Exterior... No seremos de Israel, pero tanto tú como yo somos "ovejas perdidas".

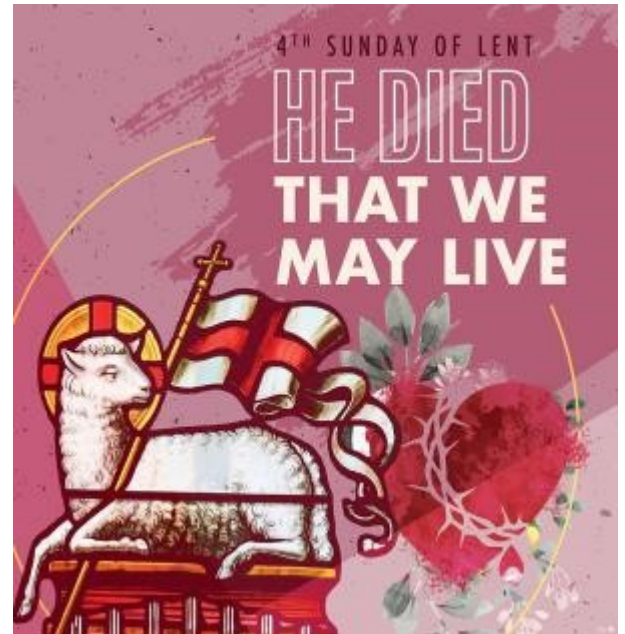
