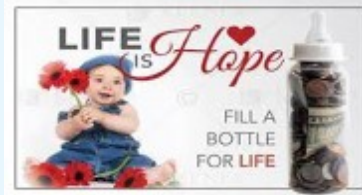

VIRTUS, PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN FOR ADULTS

All employees of the Archdiocese (including clergy and consecrated laymen and laywomen) and all volunteers (including Vacation Bible School volunteers), over the age of 18, who have substantial contact with children and/or youth, in the school or church, are required to submit a background check and attend VIRTUS, the awareness session of the Archdiocese's child abuse program, Protecting God's Children for Adults, prior to working with children or youth.

All VIRTUS sessions are online, **however, this will be changing soon.** You will need to register an account with our Archdiocese and complete the background check and paperwork.

1. Click on "First-Time Registrant"
2. Click on "Begin the registration process."
3. On the "Select" organization drop-down menu, select "Kansas City in Kansas (Archdiocese)".
4. Create a User ID and Password, complete the profile information, and select a class to attend.
5. You must complete the background check and paperwork at this point.
6. Plan to have 20-30 minutes to register and complete the online paperwork. The system will not allow you to save what you start working on and return at a later time to complete. DO NOT USE THE BACK BUTTON ON THE ADDRESS BAR, OR IT WILL DELETE YOUR PROGRESS AND YOU WILL HAVE TO START OVER.
7. VIRTUS Registration MUST BE DONE ON A COMPUTER, not a tablet, iPad or phone. The system will not allow these devices due to security reasons.
8. Complete training Protecting God's Children® Online Awareness Session 3.0 Online, this takes about 3 hours.
9. Be aware you will have monthly training bulletins emailed to you that take about 2-5 minutes to complete. You must stay current to volunteer.

Ten Ecological Education Actions Your Family Can Take Today

These ten Ecological Education actions, encouraging learning about our common home and the ways to protect it, can be done right now in your home and community:

1. Read a paragraph or passage from Laudato Si' every week; discuss it as a family and decide on concrete actions to take in response
2. Map three to five different trees at your home or in a local park and find out whether they are native, domesticated, or invasive
3. If appropriate, volunteer at your children's or grandchildren's school, supporting activities that teach ecological awareness, such as reading a book on ecology or writing letters of thanks to teachers who focus on ecology
4. If your family keeps a pet, encourage your children to consider how the pet represents all animal life
5. If your family keeps a garden or a collection of potted plants, encourage your children to consider how it represents all plant life
6. Help your children experience nature in mindful ways by taking a walk and demonstrating to them how to quietly listen to God's message in Creation
7. Emphasize Catholic social teaching on human rights, especially the rights of those who are most vulnerable, during

times of family prayer

8. Involve all members of the family in the planning of Laudato Si' initiatives, with special attention to children and young people
9. Share the comprehensive approach of integral ecology: that it respects all life on Earth, including human life
10. Identify a neighborhood rubbish dump, empty lot, or similar place and organize work days to plant plants, install ponds and other habitats, or otherwise do what is necessary to restore the space to become a thriving habitat

Dive Deeper into Ecological Education

CAFOD—an international development charity and the official aid agency of the Catholic Church in England and Wales—has provided an invaluable webinar outlining 17 Sustainable Development Goals, including specific goals related to Ecological Education.

As further inspiration, each step of the way, Green Churches, a charitable organization helping Christian communities in Canada care for God's Creation, offers these beautiful prayers for creation from the Psalms and the Saints.

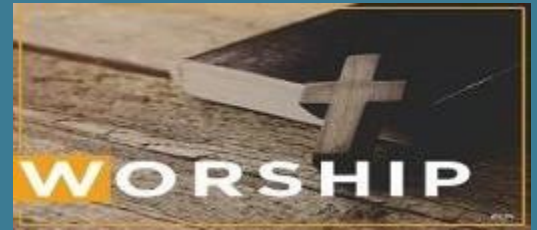

CUENTO NÚMERO 37

Jesús no tiene pelos en la lengua y les canta cuatro verdades a los fariseos (Mateo 23, 13-16)

El cuento que hoy les voy a contar es la pura verdad: lo digo con plena certeza de lo que afirmo,

Había una vez, en Israel, unos señores llamados "fariseos" precisamente porque eran una manga de fariseos, hipócritas, dobles, duros de corazón y más vanidosos que pavo real, con su cola en tecnicolor ampliamente desplegada. ¡Eran "una" pinturita", buenos tipos, virtuosos y observantes! No comían carne los viernes, ayunaban celosamente el miércoles de ceniza, el viernes santo, todos los viernes del año, sin suplantar el ayuno por uno que otro Padrenuestro o alguna macana por el estilo. Además, como en los viejos buenos tiempos, también ayunaban en las vigiliyas que precedían a las grandes fiestas. Estos señores (no se nos dice que haya habido "fariseas" mujeres, aunque ahora también las hay), eran químicamente puros e inimputables, porque no había pecado que endilgarles. Pero, sobre todo, ellos repetían hasta el cansancio que no eran "como los otros", porque "los otros" eran pecadores, inobservantes, tibios que vegetaban en su mediocridad.

Por lo tanto, esa gente (que no termina de morir.....) se daba golpes contra la frontalidad de Jesús, hombre sin doblez y Dios sin términos medios. Si bien, muchas veces, era prudente callar, en otras ocasiones, hacer silencio ante el pecado podía ser la mayor de las imprudencias.

Pues bien: Jesús caminaba un día por la Ben-Gurion Street, una peatonal muy concurrida de Jerusalén, y se topó con grupito de fariseos, que como "skin-heads prepotentes, se estaban pavoneando mirando vidrieras y tratando de cambiar su Rólex por otro más tino, para no errar ni por un segundo las mil devociones que tenían que practicar en el día. Además, buscaban una boutique que vendiera flecos más largos para sus mantos, pus la comunidad de París usaba unos, dorados y brillantes, que eran espléndidos y glorificaban a Dios más que otros, menos finos. Para Dios ¡todo!, afirmaban sin dudar.

El Señor los vio y le vinieron unas ganas locas de cruzarse a la otra vereda, con el pretexto de tomarse un heladito en Freddo's, pues el calor apretaba. Pero no se cruzó y decidió deciles todo lo que no sólo él, sino también el pueblo, pensaba de ellos. Y el "dulce Jesús", el que acariciaba a los niñitos, daba monedas a los mendigos y ayudaba a cruzar la calle a los ciegos con bastón blanco, ese dulce Jesús comenzó con una andanada de misiles que dejó a los Tomahawk como cañitas voladoras. Les dijo de todo, menos "lindos chicos".

¡Hipócritas... guías ciegos... insensatos, injustos... faltos de misericordia... sepulcros blanqueados, hermosos por fuera, y por dentro, llenos de muerte y podredumbre... raza de víboras... asesinos de profetas... factores de desunión...!

Me juego el cuello (aunque no está en el texto revelado), que debe haberles añadido: - ¡Desgraciados, descastados, bastardos, porquería de tipos, sinvergüenzas, pandilleros, fulleros, alcahuetes, corruptos, terroristas espirituales, chantas, truchos, trepadores, hienas amantes de la carroña, celosos,

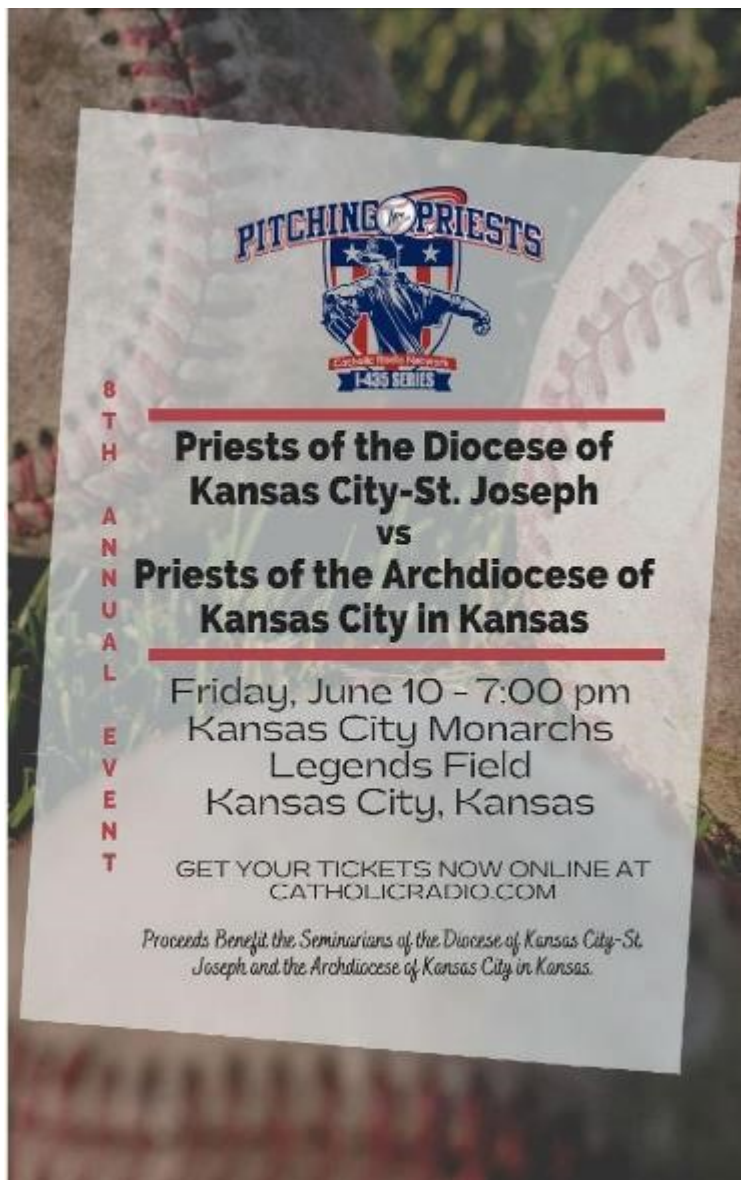

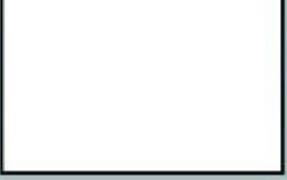
